## MONTHLY REPORT

## PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION AND GASOLINE SALES IN CANADA - JULY, 1937.

CRUDE PETROLEUM - The production of crude petroleum and natural gasoline in Canada during July amounted to 241,737 barrels as compared with 209,181 barrels in June and 139,940 barrels in July, 1936, according to a statement just published by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Output during the seven months ending July totalled 1,303,418 barrels; this represented an increase of 58.4 per cent over the total for the corresponding period of 1936.

Alberta's production advanced to 226,000 barrels from the June output of 191,634 barrels. The July total included 223,372 barrels from the Turner Valley field, 1,242 barrels from the Red Coulee field, and 1,586 barrels from the Wainwright-Ribstone field.

Petroleum and its products exported from Canada in July were valued at \$183,968; in the preceding month the export valuation was \$109,841.

Imports of petroleum, asphalt and their products into Canada in July were appraised at \$6,839,057 as against the June valuation of \$6,377,569. Crude petroleum receipts in July totalled 165,480,023 imperial gallons and consisted of 124,597,100 imperial gallons from the United States, 27,144,087 imperial gallons from Venezuela, 10,999,954 imperial gallons from Colombia, and 2,738,882 imperial gallons from Peru.

NATURAL GAS - Natural gas production in Canada during July totalled 1,223,331 thousand cubic feet; in June, 1,340,699 thousand cubic feet were produced while in July, a year ago, the output was 1,210,414 thousand cubic feet. During the seven months ending July, 16,359,618 thousand cubic feet were produced as compared with 17,019,169 thousand cubic feet in the corresponding months of 1936.

Mixed gas (natural and artificial) imported into Canada in July amounted to 9,324 thousand cubic feet at \$6,092; during June, 9,318 thousand cubic feet worth \$6,012 were imported.
