## MONTHLY REPORT

PETROLEUM and NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - DECEMBER, 1938.

and

GASOLINE SALES IN CANADA - NOVEMBER, 1938.

CRUDE PETROLEUM - The Canadian production of crude petroleum and natural gasoline during December amounted to 489,303 barrels compared with 445,514 barrels in the preceding month and 408,681 barrels in December, 1937, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the calendar year 1938 Canada produced 6,946,479 barrels; a year ago, 2,296,033 barrels were produced.

Production from Alberta sources totalled 472,774 barrels and consisted of 468,806 barrels from the Turner Valley field, 1,177 barrels from the Red Coulee field, 1,665 barrels from the Wainwright-Ribstone field, 328 barrels from the Taber field, and 798 barrels from the Moose Dome field. The provincial government records the completion of the Producers' Crude #1 well on December 8th at 8045 feet. Thirty-eight wells were completed in this province during 1938 and drilling was in progress on 18 other wells on December 31st.

Exports of petroleum and its products from Canada in December were valued at \$145,180 compared with the November total of \$132,200. During the twelve months, the Canadian exports of these products were appraised at \$1,125,853; in the preceding year the export valuation was \$1,531,447.

Petroleum, asphalt and their products imported into Canada in December were worth \$2,137,490; the November receipts were worth \$5,676,429. Imports during the calendar year were valued at \$56,235,585; the 1937 total was 6.4 per cent higher at \$59,861,942. Crude petroleum importations amounted to 41,005,369 imperial gallons in December and consisted of \$4,966,369 imperial gallons received from the United States, 3,081,000 imperial gallons from Colombia, and 2,958,000 imperial gallons from Venezuela. Imports of crude petroleum during the period Jenuary to December totalled 1,228,560,309 imperial gallons; a year ago, 1,362,015,124 imperial gallons were imported.

NATURAL GAS - Natural gas production in Canada during December rose to 4,056,990 thousand cubic feet from the preceding month's total of 3,354,385 thousand cubic feet. In December, 1937, the output was 4,306,905 thousand cubic feet. The output during the calendar year totalled 33,159,466 thousand cubic feet compared with 32,380,991 thousand cubic feet in 1937.

Imports of mixed gas (natural and artificial) were recorded at 8,279 thousand cubic feet worth \$5,874; in the previous month, 8,124 thousand cubic feet at \$4,885 were imported. During 1938, the Canadian imports of this gas amounted to 133,062 thousand cubic feet at \$87,311; a year ago, 114,275 thousand cubic feet with a valuation of \$74,799 were imported.




