<u>CRUDE PETROLEUM</u> - The Canadian output of crude petroleum and natural gasoline rose to 816,257 barrels in October from the preceding month's total of 720,866 barrels and the October, 1938 production of 688,825 barrels, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Production during the first ten months of the current year aggregated 6,603,374 barrels or 9.5 per cent above the output, a year ago.

Alberta produced 796,147 barrels in October, made up of 793,250 barrels from the Turner Valley field, 1,076 barrels from the Red Coulee field 707 barrels from the Wainwright field and 1,114 barrels from the Mocse Domo and Del Bonita fields. According to the provincial government records, the following wells were completed in the Turner Valley field during October:

> Royal Canadian # 3 on October 2nd at 8,687 feet. Royalite # 42 on October 5th at 8,491 feet. Anglo-Canadian # 8 on October 19th at 7,785 feet. Argus # 1 on October 19th at 7,384 feet.

Exports of petroleum and its products from Canada in October were valued at \$222,073 compared with the preceding month's export valuation of \$111,744.

Canada imported petroleum, asphalt and their products to a value of \$6,915,569 in October; during September, the imports of these products were worth \$5,901,699. Crude petroleum importations in October totalled 153,349,405 imperial gallons and consisted of 114,661,405 imperial gallons from the United States, 31,914,000 imperial gallons from Venezuela and 6,774,000 imperial gallons from Colombia.





<u>NATURAL GAS</u> - Natural gas production in Canada during October amounted to 2,822,445 thousand cubic feet compared with 2,099,093 thousand cubic feet in September and, 2,523,472 thousand cubic feet in October, 1938. During the first ten months of the current year, 27,896,927 thousand cubic feet were produced; in the corresponding period of 1938 the output totalled 25,970,379 thousand cubic feet.

Mixed gas (natural and artificial) imported into Canada in October declined to 7,167 thousand cubic feet worth \$5,193 from the preceding month's total of 12,622 thousand cubic feet at \$8,638.


