## MONTHLY REPORT

## PETROLEUM and NATURAL GAS PRODUCTION IN CANADA - MAY, 1939 and GASOLINE SALES IN CANADA - APRIL, 1939.

CRUDE PETROLEUM - Crude petroleum and natural gasoline production in Canada advanced to 713,450 barrels in May from the April total of 558,779 barrels and the May, 1938, total of 566,086 barrels, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Output during the first five months of the current year totalled 2,544,472 barrels or 6.8 per cent above the production.a.year ago.

Production from Alberta sources amounted to 690,066 barrels made up of 686,832 barrels from the Turner Valley field, 1,132 barrels from the Red Coulee field, 779 barrels from the Wainwright field and 1,323 barrels from the Moose Dome and Steveville fields. The following wells were completed in Alberta during May, according to provincial government records -

East Crest #4 . . . . . . . . . on May 9th at 8,040 feet. York #2 . . . . . . . . . . on May 24th at 8,027 feet. Okalta #8 . . . . . . . . . . . . on May 28th at 7,121 feet.

Canada exported petroleum and its products to a value of \$132,019 in May; in the preceding month the exports were worth \$15,461.


Petroleum, asphalt and their products imported into Canada in May were appraised at \$5,379,836 compared with the April valuation of \$2,151,949. Importations of crude petroleum rose to 128,368,301 imperial gallons from the April receipts of 45,640,730 imperial gallons; in May, a year ago, 133,389,819 imperial gallons were imported. The crude petroleum imports during the month under review consisted of 89,721,301 imperial gallons from the United States, 26,611,000 imperial gallons from Colombia, and 12,036,000 imperial gallons from Venezuela.

NATURAL GAS - The Canadian output of natural gas in May was recorded at 2,120,534 thousand cubic feet; in April, 3,147,608 thousand cubic feet were produced while in May, 1938, the output was 2,127,894 thousand cubic feet. During the first five months of 1939 Canada produced 17,223,445 thousand cubic feet; this represented an increase of 5.9 per cent over the output a year ago.


Mixed gas (natural and artificial) imports in May amounted to 8,799 thousand cubic feet worth \$5,649; in April, 9,959 thousand cubic feet valued at \$5,975 were imported.


