## ELEVER, LEAD AND ZINC PRODUCTION IN CANADA - DECEMBER, 1934.

SILVER - Canada's silver production in December amounted to 1,363,238 ounces as compared with 1,535,079 ounces in November and 1,096,399 ounces in December, 1933, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the calendar year 1934 the Canadian silver output totalled 16,219,212 ounces, an advance of 6.8 per cent over the preceding year's total.

Guotations for silver on the New York market, in Canadian funds, averaged 53.72807 cents per ounce in December; valued at this price the Canadian output during the month was worth \$732,441. The average price for November was 52.956 cents per ounce and the value of the month's production was \$812,916.

Exports of silver bullion from Canada in December consisted of 445,816 ounces shipped to the United States; in the preceding month 206,384 ounces were exported to the United States, 362,513 ounces to British India and 200,906 ounces to Great Britain. Silver bullion exports from Canada totalled 10,664,182 ounces in the calendar year 1934 as compared with 10,738,729 ounces in 1933. Shipments of silver in ore, concentrates, etc., from Canada in December declined to 56,025 ounces from the November total of 130,730 ounces. During the twelve months ending December the silver content of ores and concentrates, etc., exported from Canada amounted to 1,745,152 ounces; in 1933 the silver content was 3,362,354 ounces.

Imports of silver bullion into Canada in December were valued at \$712,199 or 16.4 per cent above the November valuation. The value of silver bullion importations during 1934 was recorded at \$2,193,201 as against the preceding year's total of \$674,138.




LEAD - Lead production in Canada during December reached a total of 32,146,753 pounds; in November 31,571,724 pounds were produced and in December, 1933, the output was 19,953,733 pounds. Production during the twelve months ending December totalled 345,626,716 pounds, an increase of 29.7 per cent over the 1933 output.

The average price of lead on the London market, in Canadian funds, in December was 2.2504 cents per pound at which price the Canadian output during the month was worth 723,431. In November, lead averaged 2.269 cents per pound and the month's production was valued at 716,362.

Canadian exports of lead in pigs in December amounted to 25,004,200 pounds or 12.9 per cent above the November total. There were no exports of lead in ore from Canada during December; in the preceding month 1,654,500 pounds were exported.

The world output of refined lead in December totalled 129,951 tons or 4,192 tons per day as compared with 125,612 tons and 4,187 tons per day in the preceding month. In the United States 32,500 tons were produced as against 29,755 tons in November. Mexico's output advanced to 17,457 tons from the November total of 15,880 tons. A 4.7 per cent decline was recorded in Australia's production; the December output was 16,554 tons while in November 17,367 tons were produced.

The British Metal Corporation reports that lead consumption in the United Kingdom in 1934 reached a new high level of approximately 320,000 tons as against 280,000 tons in 1933. World stocks outside the United States, according to this report, were reduced in 1934 by about 40,000 tons to 255,000 tons. This represents not more than three months consumption at current rates. During the first six months of 1934 Germany was supplementing her monthly smelter production of approximately 10,000 tons with net imports of over 5,000 tons per month, but in the second half of



the year the latter dropped to under 2,000 tons per month. In December, German buying of foreign lead was again on a larger scale.

The United States production of refined lead from domestic and secondary and foreign sources totalled 412,298 short tons in 1934 as compared with 374,153 tons, a year ago. Stocks on hand in the United States on December 31st amounted to 235,457 tons, or an increase of 32,396 tons during the year. Domestic lead shipments in the United States, according to the Metal and Mineral Markets, advanced 9.4 per cent in 1934 to 379,807 tons. Compared with 1933, shipments to the cable, ammunition and battery industries increased; on the other hand, there were declines in the tonnages shipped to the tin-foil and brass-making industries.



ZINC - The production of zinc in Canada during December was reported at 27,684,930 pounds; in November 27,222,359 pounds were produced and in December, 1933, the output was 22,238,145 pounds. Canada's zinc production in 1934 set up a new high record and amounted to 298,704,763 pounds. During 1933 the Canadian output totalled 199,131,984 pounds.

On the London market zinc quotations averaged 2.5589 cents per pound (in Canadian funds) as compared with the November average of 2.6102 cents per pound. Based on these prices the Canadian production in December was worth \$708,430 and in November, \$710,558.

Customs' records show that the zinc content of zinc concentrates exported from Canada in December amounted to 498 tons; the November total was 798 tons. Exports of zinc spelter advanced to 11,920 tons from the November exportations of 10,266 tons.

The world production of zinc in December was recorded at 119,548 tons as compared with 116,358 tons in the preceding month. The United States output in December advanced 2.0 per cent to 35,685 tons, on the other hand the Anglo-Australian production was 1.1 per cent lower at 10,879 tons. Zinc stocks in the United States increased 3,978 tons in December to 119,830 tons; on January 1, 1934, approximately 105,560 tons were on hand. Stocks held by the International Zinc Cartel declined 1,114 tons in December to 121,630 tons; at the end of 1933 the Cartel's stocks totalled 147,975 tons.

A meeting of the members of the International Zinc Cartel, which was to have taken place on December 20th, did not take place. As a result, the Cartel automatically ceased to exist after December 31, 1934.


The following extract from a Review of Base Metal Conditions by the British Metal Corporation Ltd. is of interest:

"The United Kingdom consumption of spelter increased 30,000 tons in 1934, due to the larger demand for brass for its buildings, motor and electrical applications and to a greatly expanded output of galvanised hollow-ware, tanks, wire and other products. Towards the end of the year the United Kingdom exports of galvanised sheets increased and this added to the domestic demand for spelter, which is now probably around 14,000 tons per month. For 1935 this demand appears likely to be broadly maintained.

"In the last part of the year the new smalting plants in Germany and the United Kingdom have been in expanding operation, and have been chiefly responsible for the increase in world production outside the United States, which has taken place in the last three months. As from August, the permitted production under the Zinc Cartel was raised from 50% to 60%, but for the most part this merely reduced the amount of the fines to be paid by those groups which already showed excess productions."
