SILVER, LEAD AND ZINC PRODUCTION IN CANADA, SEPTEMBER, 1934.

SILVER - Silver producers in Canada reported an output of 1,333,597 ounces in September as compared with 1,725,673 ounces in August and 1,258,432 ounces in September, 1933, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Production during the first nine months of 1934 totalled 12,008,278 ounces or 5.2 per cent above the output in the corresponding months of 1933.

Silver quotations on the New York market continue to advance; in September the average price was 49.484 cents per ounce as against 48.986 cents per ounce in August and 46.31 cents per ounce in July. The September average price in Canadian funds was 48.0678 cents per ounce; valued at this price the month's output in Canada was worth \$641,031. In August the average price was 47.8532 cents per ounce and the computed value of the production during the month was \$825,790.

Canada exported silver bullion in September to a total of 1,182,331 ounces made up of 827,624 ounces to the United States and 354,707 ounces to British India. In August, 1,027,973 ounces were exported, of which Great Britain received 599,503 ounces, the United States 263,650 ounces, and British India, 164,820 ounces.


The American Bureau of Metal Statistics estimated the world output of silver in September at 14,974,000 ounces or 499,133 ounces per day as compared with the August total of 15,481,000 ounces or 499,387 ounces per day. Mexico's production decreased 6.7 per cent to 6,098,000 ounces from the preceding month's output of 6,536,000 ounces. The United States produced 1,786,000 ounces of silver in September, a decline of 14.4 per cent from the August total of 2,087,000 ounces.

Stocks of silver at United States refineries increased 397,000 ounces in September to 5,465,000 ounces. Canadian refinery stocks totalled 2,739,000 ounces on September 30th, an increase of 482,000 ounces during the month. Shanghai silver stocks on September 29th were equivalent to 348,460,000 ounces, a decline of 31,000,000 ounces during September. Indian currency reserve in silver coin and bullion on September 30th was equivalent to 338,766,000 ounces; at the end of August 340,828,000 ounces were on hand.

Considerable interest was aroused in September by the announcement of the projected establishment of silver futures markets in Canada at Montreal and Toronto. On October 22nd the Montreal market was opened. According to the President of this exchange the market is designed primarily to provide hedging facilities for producers, dealers, consumers, arbitrageurs and foreign exchange bankers.

LEAD - The Canadian production of lead in September reached a total of 32,269,623 pounds, the highest monthly output on record since March, 1932. During August 30,276,573 pounds were produced while in September, 1933, the output was 23,487,631 pounds. Output during the nine months ending September totalled 251,681,688 pounds, an increase of 27.6 per cent over the production in the corresponding period of 1933.

Quotations for lead on the London market, in Canadian funds, have shown a steady decline since April when the average price was 2.6427 cents per pound; in September the average was 2.2515 cents per pound. On the New York market lead quotations ranged from an opening high bid of 3.75 cents per pound to a closing low of 3.6 cents per pound. The September quotations on the St. Louis market followed a similar trend; opening at 3.6 cents per pound and closing at 3.45 cents per pound.


Canada exported lead in ore to a total of 456,700 pounds in September as against 5,955,800 pounds in the previous month. Exports of pig lead declined to 22,648,000 pounds from the August exportations of 24,112,400 pounds.

A 10.0 per cent increase was recorded in the world output of lead in September when 125,590 tons were produced as compared with 114,158 tons in the preceding month. The United States output rose 17.7 per cent to 27,070 tons from the August total of 22,999 tons. In September Australia produced 19,283 tons; during the previous month 18,755 tons were produced. The Mexican production increased 16.6 per cent to 15,150 tons from the August output of 12,990 tons.

In the United States refined lead stocks declined 4,093 tons during September to 230,219 tons. The London official Metal Exchange warehouses contained 6,438 tons of duty-free lead on September 30th and 15,967 tons in bond. On August 31st, 8,628 tons of duty-free lead were on hand and 15,847 tons in bond.

A supplementary trade agreement between Canada and France was signed in Paris on September 29, 1934, and became effective as from October 1st. The following excerpt from the Commercial Intelligence Journal shows the general and minimum rates on lead imported into France. The minimum rate applies to Canada.

ZINC - Canada's zinc production in September amounted to 27,115,656 pounds ad against 30,028,555 pounds in August and 18,619,586 pounds in September, 1933. During the first nine months of 1934 the Canadian zinc output totalled 216,785,145 pounds; in the corresponding period of 1933 the production was 134,504,590 pounds.


On the London market in September zinc quotations averaged 2.7405 cents per pound in Canadian funds, at which price the Canadian production was worth \$743,105. In the preceding month the average price was 3.024 cents per pound and the Canadian output value was \$908,064. On the St. Louis market zinc averaged 4.049 cents per pound; this was the lowest monthly average price since May, 1933.

Zinc in ore exports during September declined to 3,697,400 pounds from the August total of 4,255,400 pounds. Zinc spelter exports from Canada in September were at approximately the same level as in August and amounted to 20,119,100 pounds.

The world output of zinc in September was recorded at 103,772 tons or a daily average of 3,459 tons as against the August total of 104,095 tons or 3,358 tons per day. Zinc production in the United States during September adyanced slightly over the August output; the totals were 26,592 tons and 26,269 tons, respectively.

The International zinc Cartel stocks of zinc were increased 3,815 tons during September to a total of 124,691 tons. The September Cartel stocks were the highest on record since May, 1934.

In the United States zinc stocks recorded an increase of 4,602 tons during September to 106,794 tons. On July 31st zinc stocks in the United States were at their lowest point for the year and amounted to 97,582 tons; the high mark for the year to date was reached in January when 111,982 tons were on hand.
