## SILVER, LEAD AND ZINC PRODUCTION IN CANADA - NOVEMBER, 1935.

SILVER - Silver production in Canada during November reached a total of 1,614,085 ounces as compared with 1,299,849 ounces in the preceding month and 1,535,268 ounces in November, 1934, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Production during the first eleven months of 1935 totalled 14,646,742 ounces or 2.7 per cent below the output in the corresponding months of 1934.

Silver quotations on the New York market in November averaged 66.06144 cents per ounce in Canadian funds, at which price the Canadian output was worth \$1,066,288. The October average price was 66.2968 cents per ounce and the value of the month's production was \$861,758.

The Canadian exports of silver bullion advanced to 2,008,314 ounces from the October total of 1,265,102 ounces. The United States received 1,935,054 ounces of silver from Canada in November and Great Britain the remainder. A decline of 58.2 per cent was recorded in the exports of silver in ore, concentrates, etc.; the November total was 75,567 ounces as compared with 180,674 ounces in October.


Imports of silver bullion into Canada during November were valued at \$\293,202\$; the October importations were worth \$\131,400\$. The United States Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce reports that 546,000 ounces of refined silver bullion were shipped to Canada from the United States during November as against 197,000 ounces shipped in the preceding month.

New silver production of the world was estimated at 15,473,000 ounces in November; during October the output was recorded at 16,801,000 ounces. The Mexican production declined 26.6 per cent to 3,844,000 ounces. A decline of 4.8 per cent was shown in the United States production of silver; the November total was 3,814,000 ounces and the October, 4,008,000 ounces. The Peruvian output in November was slightly below the October total and amounted to 1,577,000 ounces.



LEAD - The Canadian production of lead during November was recorded at 32,362,403 pounds; in October, 32,800,950 pounds were produced while in November, a year ago, 31,630,995 pounds were produced. During the eleven months ending November the output was 307,625,510 pounds as compared with 314,068,473 pounds in the corresponding period of 1934.

The average price of lead on the London market in November was 3,98608 cents per pound in Canadian funds; valued at this price the Canadian output during the month was worth \$1,289,991. The October average price was 4.04646 cents per pound and the value of the month's production was \$1,327,277.

Canada exported pig lead to a total of 23,273,500 pounds in November as against 24,932,900 pounds exported in the preceding month. Exports of lead in ore, concentrates, etc., declined to 150,300 pounds from the October total of 838,000 pounds.

Refined lead production of the world rose to 148,074 tons from the October output of 132,013 tons. This increase was due, in the main part, to advances in output in Mexico and Australia; the former country's production rose 66.7 per cent to 20,939 tons in November and the latter, 40.8 per cent to 25,519 tohs. The United States output in November was off 4.3 per cent at 36,229 tons and the German total recorded a 3.0 per cent falling-off to 11,886 tons.



ZINC - An advance of 4.8 per cent was recorded in the Canadian production of zinc during November; the month's output totalled 28,817,962 pounds as compared with 27,486,985 pounds in October. The November, 1934, production amounted to 27,210,960 pounds. During the eleven months ending November, 291,306,979 pounds of zinc were produced in Canada; this represented an increase of 7.5 per cent over the total for the corresponding period of 1934.

Quotations for zinc, on the London market, in November averaged 3.5983 cents per pound in Canadian funds as against 3.65335 cents per pound in the previous month. Valued at the average price for the month the Canadian output in November Was worth \$1,036,956 and in Octobor, \$1,004,196.

Customs' records show that Canada exported 22,671,800 pounds of zinc spelter in November as compared with 27,493,200 pounds exported in October. Exports of zinc in ore, concentrates, etc., from Canada in November totalled 1,564,200 pounds or 46.5 per cent below the quantity shipped from Canada in the preceding month.

A decline of 1.6 per cent was reported in the world production of zinc during November; the month's output was 123,922 tons while in October, 125,992 tons were produced. The daily output, however, was higher in November averaging 4,131 tons as against 4,064 tons in October. The United States production increased slightly in November to 37,469 tons, on the other hand, stocks declined 10,177 tons during the month and on November 30th amounted to 85,777 tons. The London Metal Exchange official warehouses on November 30th contained 1,780 tons of duty free zinc and 7,328 tons of zinc imported in bond as compared with 1,701 tons of the former and 7,473 tons of the latter on hand on October 31st.
