SILVER, LEAD AND LINC PRODUCTION IN CANADA - FEBRUARY, 1935.

SILVER - Canada's silver production in February declined to 1,018,743 ounces from the January output of 1,243,545 ounces and the February, 1934, total of 1,469,244 ounces, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Production during the first two months of 1935 totalled 2,262,288 ounces as compared with 2,958,938 ounces a year ago.

Silver quotations on the New York market advanced slightly in February to 54.67298 cents per ounce, in Canadian funds; the January average price was 54.3418 cents per ounce. Computed at these prices the total value of the Canadian output in February was \$556,977 and in January, \$675,765.

Exports of silver bullion from Canada in February reached a total of 936,680 ounces made up of 660,287 ounces to the United States, 273,375 ounces to British India and 3,218 ounces to France. The silver content of ores, concentrates, etc., exported from Canada totalled 41,425 ounces in February.


Imports of silver bullion into Canada were valued at \$430,802 in February; the United States contributed 54.4 per cent of these imports and Great Britain the remainder. In January, silver to a value of \$597,839 was imported of which the United States supplied 84.4 per cent. According to the United States Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, 377,000 ounces of refined silver bullion were shipped to Canada from the United States in February as compared with 350,000 ounces in the preceding month.

The American Bureau of Metal Statistics reports that the world output of new silver in February amounted to 14,869,000 ounces. This total does not include Belgian Congo's production which averaged 321,500 ounces per month in 1934. In addition to the above amount the following quantities of silver bullion were shipped during February from former holdings: by Russia to Great Britain, 1,294,552 ounces and British India to Great Britain, 627,352 ounces. Silver in ore and base bullion imported into the United States in February totalled 2,576,000 ounces while refined silver bullion receipts were recorded at 26,156,000 ounces.



LEAD - Lead production in Canada during February amounted to 27,378,211 pounds; in January 22,672,565 pounds were produced while in February, 1934, the output was 27,651,190 pounds. The Canadian production during the two months ending February totalled 50,050,776 pounds or 10.6 per cent below the output in the corresponding period of 1934.

The average price of lead on the London market, in Canadian funds, was 2.227134 cents per pound in February; valued at this price the month's output in Canada was worth \$609,749. In January lead averaged 2.251729 cents per pound and the month's production was evaluated at \$510,525.

Customs' records show that Canada exported 2,983,800 pounds of lead in ore, atc. to Belgium during February. Pig Lead exports during the month amounted to 28,022,700 pounds as compared with 24,204,600 pounds in January.

The world output of refined lead in February totalled 123,954 tons or an average of 4,427 tons per day; in January, 124,756 tons or 4,024 tons per day were produced. In the United States refined lead production from domestic ore declined 2,213 tons to 24,963 tons in February. Production from secondary and foreign supplies also declined; the total for the month was 2,435 tons. Stocks on hand at the end of February were reported at 226,799 tons, which represented a decline of 5,129 tons during the month. Australia's production advanced 6.5 per cent to 18,496 tons in February; on the other hand, Mexico's output was 16.1 per cent lower at 15,365 tons.


ZINC - Zinc production in Canada during February amounted to 20,612,690 pounds; during January 26,171,826 pounds were produced while in February, 1934, the output was 19,150,013 pounds. The Canadian production during the first two months of 1935 totalled 46,784,516 pounds or 14.3 per cent above the output in the corresponding period of 1934.

Zinc quotations on the London market in February averaged 2.576595 cents per pound in Canadian funds as compared with the preceding month's average of 2.616727 cents per pound. Valued at these prices the Canadian output in February was worth \$531,106 and in January, \$684,845.

Zinc concentrates exported from Canada in February contained 3,423,900 pounds of zinc; in the preceding month the zinc content of concentrates exported was 2,841,800 pounds. Exports of zinc spelter in February rose to 26,177,800 pounds from the January total of 25,262,700 pounds.

The world output of zinc in February declined to 110,927 tons from the January production of 120,771 tons. In the United States the February daily output was 1,181 tons as compared with 1,149 tons per day in the preceding month. Stocks in the United States recorded a decline of 1,831 tons during February to 118,075 tons.

According to the London Metal Bulletin, the British Metal Exchange official warehouses on February 28th contained 2,897 tons of duty-free zinc and 8,412 tons/2inc imported in bond; on January 31st, 3,291 tons of the former and 9,585 tons of the latter were on hand.
