## SILVER, LEAD AND ZINC PRODUCTION IN CANADA - APRIL, 1935.

SILVER - The Dominion Bureau of Statistics reports that Canada produced 1,013,805 ounces of silver in April as compared with 1,278,930 ounces in March and 1,032,744 ounces in April, 1934. Production during the first four months of 1935 totalled 4,555,023 ounces or 9.7 per cent below the output in the corresponding period of 1934.

The average price of silver on the New York market, in Canadian funds, was 68.1202 cents per ounce in April. Valued at this price the Canadian production during the month was worth \$690,606. March quotations averaged 59.6208 cents per ounce and the value of the month's output was \$762,508.

Exports of silver bullion from Canada in April amounted to 654,125, consisting ounces to the United States and 129 111 ources to Creat Prits. of 525,014 ounces to the United States and 129,111 ounces to Great Britain. silver content of ore, concentrates, etc., exported from Canada in April was recorded at 16,337 ounces.

The Canadian imports of silver bullion in April were valued at \$275,134; the United States.contributed 75.6 per cent of these importations and Great Britain the In March the import valuation was \$432,737, made up of 87.2 per cent from the United States and 12.8 per cent from Great Britain. According to the United States Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce shipments of silver bullion into Canada from the United States declined to 329,000 ounces in April from the March total of 547,000 ounces.

The American Bureau of Metal Statistics reports that the world production of new silver in April amounted to 15,739,000 ounces or 524,633 ounces per day; in the preceding month 16,063,000 ounces or 518,161 ounces a day were produced.

Imports of refined silver bullion into Great Britain from British India amounted to 1,825,435 ounces in April and from Russia, 257,382 ounces. shipments, according to the American Bureau of Metal Statistics, were from previous accumulations. The United States imported ore and base bullion containing 3,019,000 ounces of silver in April; receipts of refined silver bullion during the same period totalled 15,006,000 ounces.

Owing to the sharp advance in the open market price for silver the United States government revised the basis on which newly mined domestic silver would be purchased. This proclamation, which became effective on April 10th, established the Government's price on domestic silver at 71.11 cents per ounce. The further increase in the world price for silver forced the United States to raise the Government price for newly mined domestic silver to 77.57 cents per ounce on April 24, 1935.

LEAD - Lead production in Canada during April amounted to 24,811,329 pounds; in March 31,571,048 pounds were produced and in April, 1934, the output was 26,293,879 pounds. During the first four months of 1935 Canada produced 106,433,153 pounds of lead or 1.9 per cent above the output in the corresponding period of 1934.

The average price for lead on the London market, in Canadian funds, was 2.65489 cents per pound in April as compared with 2.372 cents per pound in the preceding month. The value of the Canadian output in April was computed at \$658,713 and in March at \$748,865.

Canada exported 18,750,500 pounds of pig lead during the month as against 28,263,300 pounds in March. There have been no exports of lead, in ore, etc., from Canada during the past two months.

The world production of refined lead in April totalled 129,147 tons; in March, 129,521 tons were produced. The average daily output in April was 4,305 tons. Production in the United States was recorded at 29,857 tons as compared with 30,118 tons in the previous month. Mexico's output advanced 42.6 per cent to 20,535 tons in April.

British official Metal Exchange warehouses contained 4,220 tons of duty free lead on April 30th and 16,619 tons of lead imported in bond. On March 31st, 4,310 tons of the former and 16,837 tons of/latter were on hand.

ZINC - The Canadian production of zinc in April declined to 23,611,883 pounds from the March total of 26,935,011 pounds and the April, 1934, output of 26,012,656 pounds. Canada produced 97,331,410 pounds of zinc during the first four months of 1935 as compared with 89,704,821 pounds in the corresponding months of 1934.

Zinc quotations on the London market averaged 2.79815 cents per pound, in Canadian funds, during April; the average for the preceding month was 2.60512 cents per pound. Valued at these prices the Canadian production during these two months was worth \$660,696 and \$701,689, respectively.

No zinc concentrates were exported from Canada in April; during the preceding month 2,074,700 pounds were exported. Exports of zinc spelter doclined to 18,437,800 pounds from the March total of 20,152,900 pounds.

Zinc production of the world amounted to 120,353 tons in April or 3.4 per cent below the tonnage produced in the preceding month. The United States output of zinc totalled 35,334 tons as against 36,667 tons in March. A 4.4 per cent decline was recorded in the Belgium and Netherlands production; the April total was 18,300 tons and the March, 19,141 tons. The Anglo-Australian output showed a slight falling-off to 12,452 tons.

Stocks of zinc held in the United States were reduced by 3,126 tons in April to 108,680 tons. The official London Metal Exchange warehouses on April 30th contained 3,793 tons of duty-free spelter and 8,669 tons imported in bond.
