## SILVER, LEAD AND MING PROJUCTION IN CANADA - JUNE, 1935.

SILVER - Silver production in Canada during June was recorded at 1,504,821 ounces as compared with 1,613,002 ounces in May and 1,261,732 ounces in June, 1934, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. Output during the six months ending June amounted to 7,672,846 ounces; in the corresponding period of the preceding year 7,792,430 ounces were produced.

The average price of silver on the New York market, in Canadian funds, was 72.0407 cents per ounce in June. Valued at this price the Canadian output during the month was worth \$1,084,084. The May average price was 74.4675 cents per ounce and the value of the month's output was \$1,201,162.

Exports of silver bullion from Canada in June included 1,192,197 ounces to the United States and 77,283 ounces to Great Britain; during the previous month 409,314 ounces were shipped to Great Britain and 239,559 ounces to the United States. The silver content of ores, concentrates, etc., shipped from Canada in June amounted to 125.156 ounces as against 148,917 ounces in the preceding month.

Customs' records show that silver bullion to a value of \$469,351 were imported into Canada in June. These imports were obtained from the following countries: Hong Kong, 55.6 per cent; the United States, 27.4 per cent, and Great Britain, 17.0 per cent. according to the United States Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, exports of silver bullion to Canada from the United States in June rose to 176,000 ounces from the May total of 72,000 ounces.


New silver production of the world in June was estimated at 15,090,000 ounces as compared with 16,072,000 ounces in May. In addition/the new silver produced in June, the world supply was augmented by shipments of former holdings of refined silver bullion to Great Britain from Russia and British India; the former country shipped 2,167,730 ounces and the latter, 488,948 ounces.


LEAD - The Canadian output of lead in June reached a total of 27,354,305 pounds; in May, 26,777,539 pounds were produced while in June, 1934, the output was 28,667,497 pounds. An advance of 0.8 per cent was recorded in the Canadian lead production during the first six months of 1935 as compared with the output for the corresponding period of 1934; the totals were 160,564,997 pounds and 159,293,939 pounds, respectively.

Quotations for lead on the London market, in Canadian funds, averaged 3.0397 cents per pound in June at which price the Canadian output during the month was worth \$831,489. In May the average price was 3.0295 cents per pound and the value of the month's production was \$811,226.

Exports of pig lead from Canada in June declined to 14,676,200 pounds from the May total of 29,491,700 pounds.

The world production of refined lead in June totalled 120,830 tons as compared with 135,383 tons in May. All the principal producing countries recorded declines in output during June. The United States showed an 11.7 per cent falling-off, Australia, 5.6 per cent, Mexico, 28.6 per cent, and Germany, 22.6 per cent.

Refined lead stocks in the United States increased 6,020 tons in June to 231,077 tons. On June 29th, the London Metal Exchange official warehouses contained 15,277 tons of lead imported in bond and 3,916 tons of duty free lead; at the beginning of the month 16,653 tons of the former and 4,007 tons of the latter were on hand.


ZINC - Canada's zinc production in June reached a total of 27,400,000 pounds as compared with 27,387,675 pounds in May and 21,608,171 pounds in June, 1934. During the six months ending June the Canadian output totalled 152,119,085 pounds; this represented an increase of 10.7 per cent over the production in the first half of 1934.

Zinc quotations on the London market, in Canadian funds, averaged 3.0304 cents per pound in June; valued at this price the Canadian output during the month was worth \$830,330. The May average price was 3.1766 cents per pound and the value of the output in Canada during the month was \$869,997.

Canada exported 15,201,100 pounds of zinc spelter during June; in May 26,337,400 pounds were exported. No zinc concentrates have been exported during the past three months.

According to the American Bureau of Metal Statistics the world output of zinc in June totalled 118,664 tons or 3,955 tons per day as against 123,807 tons or 3,994 tons per day in May. The United States production in June was at approximately the same level as in May and amounted to 34,677 tons. The Belgian and Netherlands output declined 7.2 per cent to 16,700 tons. The Anglo-Australian production of 12,107 tons was off 2.8 per cent while Germany's decreased 4.2 per cent to 10,990 tons.

On June 29th stocks of zinc held in the United States were recorded at 112,909 tens or an increase of 5,284 tens during the month. The London Metal Exchange official warehouses at the end of June contained 2,967 tens of duty free zinc and 8,761 tens of zinc imported in bond; on May 31st, 3,513 tens of duty free zinc and 8,842 tens imported in bond were on hand.
