SILVER, LEAD AND ZINC PRODUCTION IN CANADA - JULY, 1935.

SILVER - Canada produced 1,162,907 cunces of silver in July according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In June, 1,504,821 cunces were produced while in July, 1934, the production was 1,299,227 cunces. During the seven months ending July the Canadian output totalled 8,835,753 cunces as against 9,091,657 cunces in the corresponding period of 1934.

Silver quotations on the London market averaged 68.36539 cents per ounce in Canadian funds during July; in June the average price was 72,0407 cents per ounce. Based on these prices the Canadian output in July was worth \$795,026 and in June, \$1,084,084.

Silver bullion exports from Canada in July consisted of 1,004,430 ounces to the United States, 75,043 ounces to Great Britain and 20,591 ounces to Germany; in June, 1,192,197 ounces were exported to the United States and 77,283 ounces to Great Britain. Exports of silver in ore, concentrates, etc., were recorded at 129,612 ounces or 3.6 per cent above the June total.


The value of silver bullion imported into Canada in July advanced to \$1,383,725 from the June valuation of \$469,351. The United States accounted for 80 per cent of the July importations, Hong Kong, 14 per cent, and Great Britain, 6 per cent. Refined silver bullion exports from the United States into Canada during July amounted to 587,000 ounces, according to a report by the United States Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce.

The world production of new silver in July totalled 17,284,000 ounces as compared with 15,157,000 ounces in June. The American Bureau of Metal Statistics states that these figures do not include the production of Katanga which in 1934 averaged 280,775 ounces per month. Shipments of refined silver bullion from former holdings also augmented the world supply; in July, Great Britain received 523,926 ounces of this bullion from British India and 990,459 ounces from Russia.


<u>LEAD</u> - Lead production in Canada during July amounted to 29,104,210 pounds as compared with 27,354,305 pounds in June and 31,298,691 pounds in July, 1934. Output during the seven months ending July totalled 189,669,207 pounds; this represented a 0.5 per cent decline from the production during the corresponding period of 1934.

The average price of lead on the London market in July was 3.20464 cents per pound, (in Canadian funds). Valued at this price the Canadian output during the month was worth \$932,685. The June average price was 3.0397 cents per pound and the value of the month's production was \$831,489.

Canada exported 21,087,900 pounds of pig lead and 494,900 pounds of lead in ore, concentrates, etc., during July. Exports of pig lead during the January to July period totalled 164,496,900 pounds and of lead in ore, concentrates, etc., 4,825,700 pounds.

Refined lead production of the world advanced to 128,470 tons in July or 4,144 tons per day from the June total of 120,530 tons or 4,018 tons a daw. Increases in output were recorded by all the principal producing countries except Spain. Production in the United States rose 3.9 per cent; in Mexico, 39. por cent, and in Australia, 3.1 per cent.

Stocks of refined lead in the hands of United States producers were recorded at 230,915 tons; on June 30th, 231,077 tons were on hand. London Metal Exchange official warehouses on July 31st contained 3,442 tons of duty free lead and 14,131 tons of lead imported in bond.


ZINC - The production of zinc in Canada during July declined to 27,568,983 pounds from the June output of 28,163,152 pounds. In July, a year ago, 22,177,066 pounds were produced. The Canadian output during the first seven months of 1935 totalled 179,126,879 pounds or 12.3 per cent above the production in the corresponding months of 1934.

Quotations for zinc on the London market, in Canadian funds, averaged 3.11904 cents per pound in July as against 3.0304 cents per pound in June. Based on these prices the July output was worth \$859,888 and the June, \$830,330.

Exports of zinc spelter from Canada in July were recorded at 24,213,800 pounds and of zinc, in ore, concentrates, etc., at 1,144,200 pounds. During the seven months ending July 155,783,500 pounds of zinc spelter and 9,484,600 pounds of zinc, in ore, concentrates, etc., were exported.

The world output of zinc in July, according to the American Bureau of Metal Statistics declined to 118,385 tons from the June total of 118,664 tons. The falling-off in production permday was more noticeable; the July daily average was 3,819 tons while the June average was 3,955 tons.

Zinc stocks in the United States rose 2,814 tons during July to 115,723 tons. Stocks in the London Metal Exchange official warehouses on July 31st included 2,844 tons of duty free zinc and 8,569 tons imported in bond; at the end of June 2,967 tons of the former and 8,761 tons of the latter were on hand.
