MONTHLY REPORT

AND ZINC PRODUCTION IN CANADA - JUNE, 1936.

SILVER - Silver production in Canada during June amounted to 1,656,683 ounces, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In May, 1,419,146 ounces were produced while in June, 1935, the output was 1,524,740 ounces.

The average price of silver on the New York market (Handy and Harman) was 44.86635 cents per ounce, in Canadian funds; valued at this price the Canadian output during the month was worth \$743,293. In May silver averaged 44,94976 cents per ounce and the computed value of the month's output was \$637,903.

Canada exported 1,419,767 ounces of silver bullion in June as against 1,225,912 ounces exported in May. The silver content of ore, concentrates, etc., exported from Canada in June amounted to 147,849 ounces; in May the silver content was higher at 186,611 ounces.

Imports of silver bullion into Canada in June declined to 290,950 ounces worth \$125,185 from the May total of 1,105,383 ounces at \$487,021. The United States supplied 96.1 per cent of June imports and Great Britain, the remainder.


New silver production in the United States advanced to 5, 293,000 ounces in June from the May output of 4,754,000 ounces. Peru produced 1,580,000 ounces as against 1,500,000 ounces in the preceding month.



LEAD - The Canadian output of lead in June was recorded at 28,523,448 pounds as compared with 32,047,660 pounds in the preceding month and 27,509,446 pounds in June, 1935.

Quotations for lead on the London market in June averaged 3.40837 cents per pound in Canadian funds; valued at this price the Canadian output during the month was worth \$972,185. In May, the average price was 3.4525 cents per pound and the month's production was valued at \$1,106,445.

Pig lead exports from Canada in June rose to 36,465,200 pounds from the May exports of 25,784,900 pounds. Exportations of lead in ore, concentrates, etc., from Canada in June amounted to 147,100 pounds; in the preceding month none was exported.

The world production of refined lead in June totalled 135,287 tons as agaidst 144,725 tons produced in May. All the principal lead-producing countries recorded declines in output during June. The United States showed a 7.1 per cent falling-off, Mexico, 10.0 per cent, Australia, 8.3 per cent, and Germany, 1.00per cent.


ZINC - Canada's zinc production in June reached a total of 29,988,104 pounds as compared with 29,629,858 pounds in the preceding month and 28,254,101 pounds in June, 1935.

Zinc quotations on the London market, in Canadian funds, averaged 3.12213 cents per pound in June; the May average price was 3.2315 cents per pound. Based on these prices the Canadian production during these two months was worth \$936,268 and \$957,489, respectively.

Canada exported 28,645,600 pounds of zinc spelter in June; during the previous month 32,949,800 pounds were exported. No zinc concentrates were exported in June; during May, 879,200 pounds were shipped to Belgium.

The American Bureau of Metal Statistics estimated the world output of zinc in June at 131,665 tons or 4,389 tons per day as against 137,737 tons or 4,443 tons per day in May. Production in the United States advanced 42 tons during the month to 44,947 tons. Germany's output was slightly lower at 12,456 tons and the Australian production of 11,957 tons was off 487 tons.
