## MONTHLY REPORT

## SILVER, LEAD AND ZIMC PRODUCTION IN CANADA, SEPTEMBER, 1937.

SILVER - The Canadian production of silver in September declined to 2,557,798 ounces from the August total of 3,129,097 ounces, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Eureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In September, 1936, the output totalled 1,352,420 ounces. Production during the first nine months of 1937 aggregated 17,424,085 ounces compared with 13,217,411 ounces a year ago.

Silver quotations on the New York market (Handy and Harman) averaged 44.752 cents per ounce, in Canadian funds; valued at this price the Canadian output during the month was worth (1,055,162. In August the average price was 44.754 cents per ounce and the value of the month's production was (1,400,396.

In September Canada exported silver bullion to a total of 1,185,206 ounces, made up of 1,127,650 ounces to the United States and 57,550 ounces to Great Britain. Exports of silver in ores, concentrates, etc., from Canada in September advanced to 1,035,206 ounces from the preceding month's total of 1,075,457 ounces.

Imports of silver bullion into Canada rose 61 per cent to 172,764 ounces from the August total of 107,300 ounces. During the nine months ending September,1937, Canada imported 1,584,343 ounces of silver bullion.

Silver production in the United States during September declined to 5,779,000 ounces from the previous month's total of 7,441,000 ounces. Stocks in the United States increased 67,000 ounces during the month to 1,363,000 ounces. In Peru,1,260,000 ounces were produced; during the preceding month the output was 1,333,000 ounces. Refined silver production in Australia rose to 900,000 ounces from the August output of 819,000 ounces.

LEAD - A new high monthly record was set up in the production of lead in Canada in September when 40,875,577 pounds were produced; in the preceding month the production was 40,590,935 pounds while in September, 1936, the output was 29,128,356 pounds. During the first nine months of 1937 Canada produced 312,736,666 pounds of lead compared with 276,231,352 pounds in the corresponding months of 1936.

On the London market lead quotations averaged 4.623 cents per pound, in Canadian funds, at which price the output in Canada during September was worth \$1,889,678. The August average price was 5.02 cents per pound and the value of the month's output was \$2,037,667.

Canada exported 25,384,800 pounds of pig lead in September; this represented an increase of 25.1 per cent over the August total. A 50.6 per cent decline was recorded in the exports of lead in ore, concentrates, etc., from Canada in September as compared with the preceding month; the totals were - 1,857,000 pounds and 3,762,500 pounds, respectively.

Refined lead production of the world amounted to 159,032 tons; in August, 158,352 tons were produced. The United States produced 37,989 tons of refined lead from domestic ore and 3,057 tons from secondary and foreign material. Stocks on hand in the United States declined 12,776 tons during September to 90,742 tons from the August 31st total. Mexico produced 19,743 tons of lead in September; during the previous month, 21,513 tons were produced. Australia's output rose 2,031 tons to 22,996 tons in September.

ZINC - Canadian producers reported an output of 30,769,562 pounds of zinc in September as compared with 39,849,770 pounds in August and 31,169,138 pounds in September, 1936. Production during the first nine months of 1937 totalled 278,821,062 pounds or 8.3 per cent above the output a year ago.

The average price of zinc on the London market in September was 4.71 cents per pound, in Canadian funds; based on this price the estimated return to Canadian producers during the month was \$1,449,246. In August zinc averaged 5.361 cents per pound and the computed value of the month's output was \$2,136,346.

Zinc spelter exports in September advanced to 23,225,000 pounds from the preceding month's total of 22,719,100 pounds. Exportations of zinc in ore, concentrates, etc., from Canada amounted to 2,089,800 pounds; in August, 14,853,900 pounds were exported.

The American Bureau of Metal Statistics estimated the world output of zinc in September at 151,357 tons; in August the estimated production was 156,151 tons. The United States produced 50,027 tons in September and shipped 47,737 tons with the result that stocks increased 2,290 tons during the month to 13,517 tons. Unfilled orders in the United States on September 30th amounted to 92,319 tons against the August 51st total of 106,187 tons.
