Zinc - Production of primary zinc in all forms (the recoverable zinc content of Canadian ores) during August, 1956, amounted to 35,081 tons compared with 36,987 tons in the previous month and with 37,329 tons in August, 1955.

Output of refined zinc, including amounts recovered from foreign ores treated in Canadian smelters, totalled 21,354 tons in August, 1956, compared with 21,989 tons in the corresponding month of last year.
