Zinc - Production of primary zinc in all forms (the recoverable zinc content of Canadian ores) during May, 1%0, amounted to 33,349 tons compared with 35,286 tons in the previous month and with 33,602 tons in May, 1959.

Output of refined zinc, including amounts recovered from foreign ores treated in Canadian smelters, totalled 21,701 tons in May, 1960, compared with 21,147 tons in the corresponding month of last year.
