FELDSPAR AND SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA, MARCH 1932

FELDSPAR - Shipments of feldspar by Canadian producers in March were recorded at 1,160 tons, an increase of 45 per cent over the March, 1931 total of 800 tons, according to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first quarter of 1932 the Canadian production totalled 2,905 tons as compared with 1,777 tons in the corresponding period of 1931.

Ground feldspar imported into Canada during March amounted to 157 tons worth \$3,077, in the preceding month 121 tons at \$3,276 were imported.

SALT - Commercial salt production in Canada increased 6.3 per cent to a total of 14,185 tons as compared with the March, 1931 production of 13,346 tons. Wells in southwestern Ontario and the Malagash mine in Nova Scotia accounted for the output during the month under review.

Exports of salt were recorded at 164 tons valued at \$798 as against 51 tons at \$560 exported in February. Salt importations totalled 4,484 tons, made up of 2,444 tons from the United States, 1,185 tons from British West Indies, 521 tons from Great Britain, 328 tons from Germany and 6 tons from Newfoundland. During the previous month 2,315 tons were imported into Canada.
