FEIDSPAR AND SAIT PTODUCTION IN CANADA, JULY, 1932.
FELDSPAR - Shipments of feldspar by Canadian producers in July amounted to 635 tons; in the preceiing month, 479 tons were produced and in Juiy, a year ago, the production was 2,256 tons, according to a report issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa.

Customs' records show imports of 37 tons of crude feldspar into Canada during July; June importations amounted to 31 tons. Ground feldspar imports were recorded at 67 tons or 28 per cent below the June total of 93 tons.

SALT - Salt production in Canada during July totalled 13,869 tons, a 11. 7 per cent decline from the June shipments of 15,709 tons. Sales of commercial salt by producers reached a total of 93,458 tons during the first seven months of 1932 as compared with 90,180 tons in the corresponding period of 1931.

Exports of salt from Caneda declined to 164 tons worth $\$ 2,463$ from the June total of 735 tons valued at $\$ 5,495$. Canadian imports of salt during July amounted to 7,701 tons appraised at $\$ 46,385$ as agains 13,041 tons at $\$ 65,027$ imported in June. The July importations included 3,080 tons from the United States, 1,690 tons from the British West Indies, 1,498 tons from Great Britain, 1,053 tons from Germany, 331 tons from Spain and 49 tons from Newfoundland.
