FELISPAR AND SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA, JANUARY, 1933.

FELDSPAR - Canadian producers shipped 400 tons of feldspar in January as compared with 493 tons in December and 800 tons in January, 1932, according to a report issued by the Pominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa.

Imports of crude feldspar into Canada in January amounted to 13 tons evaluated at \$139; in the preceding month 32 tons at \$335 were imported. Ground feldspar importations in January were recorded at 33 tons worth \$868.

SALT - Commercial salt production in Canada reached a total of 9,884 tons in January as against 9,833 tons produced in the preceding month and 9,723 tons in January, 1932.

Salt exports for Canada amounted to 89 tons valued at \$1,250; in December 65 tons at \$1,134 were exported. Imports of salt totalled 1,383 tons appraised at \$7,994; in the previous month 5,412 tons worth \$25,209 were imported. The January importations were obtained from the following sources, the United States, 932 tons, Germany, 299 tons, and Great Britain, 152 tons.
