FELISPAR AND SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA, DECEMBER, 1934.

FELDSPAR - Canadian producers shipped 1,436 tons of feldspar during December as compared with 1,691 tons in November and 1,228 tons in December, 1933, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the calendar year 1934 shipments totalled 15,860 tons or 48.8 per cent above the tonnage shipped in the preceding year.

Ground feldspar importations into Canada during December were recorded at 50 tons worth \$1,024 as against 72 tons at \$1,361 in the preceding month. Imports of ground feldspar during the twelve months ending December reached a total of 917 tons valued at \$14,255; in the corresponding months of the previous year, 506 tons with a valuation of \$7,374 were imported. Receipts of crude feldspar in 1934 amounted to 122 tons appraised at \$990 as compared with 55 tons at \$596 received in 1933.



SALT - Commercial salt production in Canada during December amounted to 11,531 tons; in the preceding month 20,279 tons were produced and in December, 1933, the total was 8,618 tons. Production during the twelve months ending December advanced to 195,060 tons as compared with 175,375 tons in the corresponding period of 1933.

Exports of salt from Canada in December declined to 731 tons from the November total of 1,011 tons.

Canadian imports of salt during December were recorded at 7,642 tons valued at \$35,350; in November, 16,960 tens worth \$75,584 were imported. The December importations were obtained from the following sources: the United States, 64.6 per cent; British West Indies, 14.7 per cent; Germany, 3.9 per cent; Great Britain, 7.8 per cent, and Newfoundland and Egypt, the remainder. The month's imports included 2 tons of table salt, 1,688 tons of salt for fisheries, 5,063 tons of salt in bulk and 889 tons of other salt.
