FELDSPAR AND SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA, MAY, 1934.

FELDSPAR - Shipments of feldspar by Canadian producers in May were recorded at 506 tons; in April the total was 602 tons and in May of the preceding year 528 tons were shipped, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the five months ending May 5,056 tons of feldspar were shipped as against 1,658 tons in the corresponding months of 1933.

Imports of crude feldspar in May amounted to 33 tons with a valuation of \$301. Ground feldspar importations totalled 34 tons appraised at \$434; in April 114 tons at \$1,398 were imported.

SALT - Commercial salt production in Canada during May advanced to 20,082 tons from the April total of 19,224 tons and the May, 1933, output of 17,518 tons. During the five months ending May 74,507 tons were produced as against 63,408 tons in the corresponding period of 1933.

Canada exported 603 tons of salt in May as compared with 5 tons in April.

Imports of salt rose to 21,578 tons worth \$75,269; in April 4,190 tons at \$17,433 were imported. The May importations were obtained from the following sources: Spain, 49.7 per cent; Great Britain, 19.0 per cent; the United States, 18.8 per cent; the British West Indies, 8.0 per cent; Germany, 4.4 per cent; and Newfoundland, the remainder.
