FELDSPAR AND SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA - NOVEMBER, 1935.

FELDSPAR - Shipments of feldspar by Canadian producers amounted to 2,822 tons in November, according to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In October 1,517 tons were shipped while in November, a year ago, shipments totalled 1,951 tons. During the eleven months ending November feldspar shipments were recorded at 14,745 tons as compared with 16,645 tons shipped in the corresponding period of 1934.

Imports of ground feldspar into Canada rose to 98 tons valued at \$1,833 from the October total of 48 tons at \$994. Receipts during the period January to November, 1935, amounted to 562 tons worth \$10,043.



SALT - Commercial salt shipments by Canadian producers advanced to 26,379 tons, the highest monthly output on record since 1929, the first year in which the Bureau of Statistics collected monthly reports from this industry. The October shipments were recorded at 20,303 tons while in November, 1934, the total was 20,545 tons. During the first eleven months of 1935 shipments by Canadian producers totalled 200,630 tons which was 7.9 per cent above the tonnage shipped in the corresponding period of 1934.

Exports of salt from Canada in November declined to 704 tons with a valuation of 44,686 from the October total of 981 tons at 46,019.

Imports of salt into Canada in November rose to 15,182 tons appraised at *69,539 from the preceding month's total of 14,028 tons at \$64,926. The November importations were obtained from the following countries: the United States, 6,376 tons; Great Britain, 6,261 tons; British West Indies, 2,331 tons, and Newfoundland, 214 tons. The following grades of salt were imported during the month: table salt, 12 tons; salt for the use of sea or gulf fisheries, 1,382 tons; salt, in bulk, n.o.p., 7,204 tons, and other salt, in bags, barrels and other containers, 6,584 tons.
