MONTHLY REPORT

FELDSPAR AND SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA - DECEMBER, 1935.

FELDSPAR - Canadian producers reported shipments totalling 1,072 tons in December as compared with 2,822 tons in November and 1,657 tons in December, 1934, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa.

Ground feldspar imports into Canada in December declined to 46 tons worth \$\psi 952\$ from the November total of 98 tons appraised at \$\psi 1,833\$. Imports during the calendar year 1935 totalled 608 tons with a valuation of \$\psi 10,995\$ as against 917 tons at \$\psi 14,255\$ imported in 1934.



SALT - Shipments of commercial salt by Canadian producers in December amounted to 13,260 tons; in November, 26,379 tons were shipped while in December, a year ago, 11,682 tons were shipped. During the calendar year 1935 the Canadian shipments totalled 213,890 tons or 8.2 per cent above the total for the preceding year.

An 11.5 per cent increase was recorded in the exports of salt from Canada in December; the month's total was 785 tons as against 704 tons in November.

Canada imported 5,583 tons of salt in December; during the previous month 15,182 tons were imported. The following countries were the sources of the Canadian importations in December: the United States, 65.4 per cent; Spain, 19.7 per cent; British West Indies, 8.2 per cent; Great Britain, 6.2 per cent; and Germany, the remainder. The December imports were made up of 1,154 tons of salt for the use of sea or gulf fisheries, 4,130 tons of salt, in bulk, n.o.p., and 299 tons of other salt, in bags, barrels and other containers.
