## FELDSPAR AND SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA - MARCH, 1935.

FELDSPAR - Shipments of feldspar by Canadian producers were recorded at 778 tons in March; during the previous month 566 tons were shipped while in March, 1934, shipments amounted to 1,579 tons. During the first three months of 1935 the Canadian shipments totalled 2,074 tons as against 3,948 tons in the corresponding months of 1934.

Imports of ground feldspar into Canada in March advanced to 48 tons appraised at \$961 from the February importations of 31 tons at \$252.



SALT - The Canadian production of commercial salt in March reached a total of 13,794 tons as compared with 10,853 tons in February and 14,626 tons in March, 1934. Production during the first quarter of 1935 totalled 35,783 tons or 1.7 per cent above the tonnage produced in the corresponding months of 1934.

Salt exports from Canada in March amounted to 642 tons; in the preceding month 417 tons were exported.

Imports of salt into Canada in March rose to 4,808 tons worth \$24,293 from the February total of 3,154 tons valued at \$22,073. The March importations consisted of 12 tons of table salt, 326 tons of salt for the use of sea or gulf fisheries, 4,043 tons of salt in bulk, n.o.p., and 427 tons of other salt in bags, barrels and other coverings. These imports were obtained from the following countries: the United States, 90.1,per cent; Great Britain, 5.5 per cent, and the British West Indies, Germany and Spain, the remainder.
