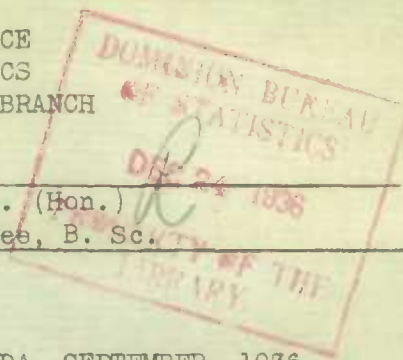

MONTHLY REPORT

FELDSPAR AND SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA, SEPTEMBER, 1936.

FELDSPAR - The Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa reports that shipments of feldspar by Canadian producers in September amounted to 2,749 tons; in August, 1,910 tons were shipped while in September a year ago 1,169 tons were shipped. Shipments during the first nine months of 1936 totalled 14,853 tons or 27.2 per cent above the total for the corresponding period of 1935.

Customs' records show that 89 tons of ground feldspar valued at \$1,628 were imported into Canada in September as compared with 44 tons at \$879 in August. Imports of ground feldspar during the nine months ending September aggregated 526 tons with a valuation of \$10,245.

SALT - Canadian producers reported shipments of commercial salt amounting to 19,404 tons in September as against 19,726 tons shipped in the preceding month and 18,225 tons in September, 1935. During the nine months ending September, 158,515 tons were shipped; a year ago shipments totalled 154,682 tons.

Exports of salt from Canada in September declined to 230 tons from the August total of 336 tons. Exportations during the period, January to September, 1936, amounted to 3,680 tons.

Canada imported 13,605 tons of salt appraised at \$58,891 in September, as compared with 13,687 tons at \$58,299 in August. The September importations included 6,253 tons of salt for sea or gulf fisheries, 3,309 tons of salt in bulk, n.o.p., and 4,043 tons of other salt in bags, barrels and other coverings. Fifty-three per cent of the September receipts were obtained from the United States, 30.3 per cent from Great Britain, 15.1 per cent from the British West Indies, 1.6 per cent from Spain, and Newfoundland.
