## HONTHLY REPORT

FHLDSAR AND SALT PRODUCTION IT CANADA - OCTOBER, 1937.

MDDSAR - Sinipments of feldspar Dy Canadian producers in Dctober amounted to 1, 64 tons; in Septeraber, 2, 216 tons vere shmped whle in October, a year ago, 1,962 tons were shipped, according to a state:nent just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics et Ottava. During the first ten months of 1957 shipments of feldspar afgregetec 17,253 tons compared with 14,914 tons in the corresponding period of 1936.

Ground feldspar importations in Octobor declined to 55 tons \%ortin 61,037 from the september total of 111 tons at 1,235 . Cancdian imnorts during the ten months ending October totalled 1,076 tous arnraised at 18,719 ; in the corresponding montins, a jear ago, 506 tons with a valuation of 11,645 were imported.

SAK? - Cunadion producers shippod 23,126 tons of commercial salt durinis Qotober compared with 25,922 tons in the preceding month and 22,496 tons shipped in October, 1936. Shipments during the first ten montis of 1937 aggregated 209,953 tons or 16 per cent above the total for tho period Janvary to October, 1936.

Exports of salt from Canada in Gctober rose to 1,224 tons from the Beptember total of 842 tons. An advance of 33.3 per cent was recorded in the arports of salt during the first ten months of the current year then 7,599 tons were athaped from Canada comnared rith 4,146 tons a year ago.

Imports of salt into Canada in October reacised a total of 17,119 tons valuad et $\$ 73,777$; in September, 14,457 tons at 37,172 rere imported. The October roceipts included 5,365 tons of salt iow sea or fulf fisheries, 6,908 tons of salt in bulk, n.0.p., and 4,848 tons of other salt in bags, barrels and other coverings. Shipments from the United Staies accounted for 37.3 per cent of the October importations; froin Great Britain, 31.3 per cent, from British lest Indies, 30.7 per cent, and from Newfoundland, the remainder.
