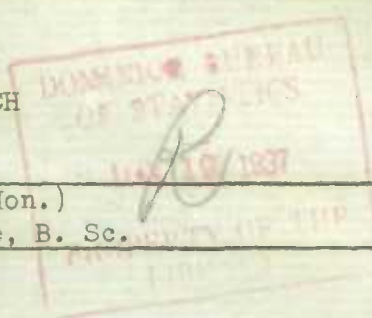

MONTHLY REPORT

FELDSPAR AND SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA - MARCH, 1937.

FELDSPAR - Feldspar shipments by Canadian producers in March were recorded at 2,061 tons according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. In February, 1,538 tons were shipped, while in March, 1936, shipments amounted to 878 tons. During the first quarter of the current year, shipments totalled 4,776 tons as compared with 2,716 tons, a year ago.

Imports of ground feldspar in March declined to 46 tons worth \$758 from the preceding month's total of 146 tons at \$2,759. Importations during the first three months of 1937 aggregated 333 tons appraised at \$6,155; in the corresponding period of the previous year 152 tons at \$2,949 were imported.

SALT - Shipments of commercial salt by Canadian producers advanced to 13,504 tons from the previous month's total of 11,706 tons. In March, 1936, shipments totalled 13,411 tons. During the first three months of this year, 37,120 tons were shipped as against 36,086 tons a year ago.

Canada exported 808 tons of salt in March as compared with 93 tons in February and 879 tons in March, 1936.

Importations of salt into Canada in March rose to 7,005 tons worth \$19,734 from the February imports of 1,797 tons at \$7,402. The March importations were received from the following countries: the United States, 46.7 per cent; British West Indies, 34.5 per cent; French Africa, 15.7 per cent and Great Britain, 3.1 per cent. Approximately 6 tons of table salt were imported in March, together with 2,527 tons of salt for sea or gulf fisheries, 4,230 tons of salt in bulk, n. o. p., and 242 tons of other salt in bags, barrels and other coverings.

CHAPTER I
GENERAL STATEMENT OF THE WORK OF THE DEPARTMENT

The Department of Public Works has during the year 1900 been engaged in the execution of the various projects authorized by the Board of Estimate and City Council during the past year. The work has been carried on in accordance with the plan adopted at the beginning of the year, and the results have been generally satisfactory.

The total amount of money expended during the year was \$10,000,000, which was an increase of 10% over the amount expended in 1899. This increase was due to the fact that the Board of Estimate and City Council authorized an increase in the appropriations for the various projects of the Department.
