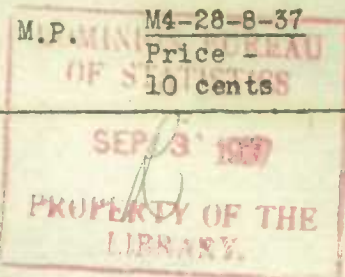

## MONTHLY REPORT

## FELDSPAR AND SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA - JUNE, 1937.

FELDSPAR - Canadian producers reported shipments of feldspar during June amounting to 1,801 tons as compared with 1,224 tons in May and 2,565 tons in June, 1936, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first six months of the current year, 8,849 tons were shipped; in the corresponding period a year ago, shipments totalled 7,335 tons.

Ground feldspar importations into Canada in June were recorded at 90 tons worth \$1,434; in May, 97 tons at \$1,611 were imported.

SALT - Commercial salt shipments by Canadian producers advanced/24,841 tons to in June from the May total of 24,343 tons and the June, 1936, total of 19,257 tons. Shipments during the six months ending June aggregated 112,405 tons or 14.2 per cent above the tonnage shipped a year ago.

Exports of salt from Canada in June declined to 658 tons from the May exports of 1,220 tons. During the first six months of 1937 Canada exported 5,287 tons of salt as against 2,901 tons in the corresponding period of 1936.

An advance of 8.3 per cent in quantity was recorded in the imports of salt into Canada in June when 14,482 tons were brought into this country. The June receipts consisted of 14 tons of table salt, 7,048 tons of salt for sea or gulf fisheries, 5,300 tons of salt in bulk, n.o.p., and 2,120 tons of other salt in bags, barrels and other coverings. British West Indies supplied 38.0 per cent of the June importations; the United States, 35.6 per cent; Great Britain, 15.5 per cent; Italy, 9.7 per cent, and Spain, the remainder.
