MONTHLY REPORT

FELDSPAR and SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA
 FEBRUARY, 1938.

FELDSPAR - The Canadian shipments of feldspar during February amounted to 705 tons compared with 1,341 tons in the preceding month and 1,558 tons in February, 1937, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first two months of 1938, Canadian producers shipped 2,046 tons; in the corresponding period of 1937 shipments totalled 2,715 tons.

Imports of ground feldspar into Canada in February were recorded at 155 tons at \$2,582; in January, 91 tons worth \$1,189 were imported. These imports were obtained from the United States.

SALT - Canadian producers reported shipments of commercial salt amounting to 12,205 tons in February; during the previous month, 11,575 tons were shipped while in February, 1937, shipments totalled 11,706 tons.

An advance of 40.1 per cent was recorded in the exports of salt from Canada in February compared with January; the totals were 622 tons and 444 tons, respectively.

Receipts of salt during February amounted to 2,331 tons appraised at \$11,165; the January imports totalled 7,714 tons at \$27,006. Importations of salt for sea or gulf fisheries in February were recorded at 521 tons with a valuation of \$1,596; of salt in bulk, n.o.p., 1,630 tons at \$6,882, and of other salt in bags, barrels and other coverings, 180 tons at \$2,547; in addition, 300 pounds of table salt worth \$120 were imported. The United States supplied 75.9 per cent of the February imports; the British West Indies, 19.7 per cent; Great Britain, 6.4 per cent; a small consignment was received from Germany.
