MONTHLY REPORT

FELDSPAR and SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA - AUGUST, 1938.

FELDSPAR - Shipments of feldspar during August amounted to 1,506 tons; in the preceding month, 886 tons were shipped while in August, a year ago, 2,118 tons were shipped, according to a statement just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first eight months of the current year, 7,978 tons were shipped compared with 13,860 tons in the corresponding period of 1937.

Imports of ground feldspar into Canada in August were recorded at 47 tons worth \$764; in July 49 tons at \$810 were imported. These importations were obtained from the United States.



SALT - Commercial salt shipments by Canadian producers advanced to 22,730 tons from the July total of 20,350 tons and the August 1937 total of 19,866 tons. A 4.7 per cent increase was recorded in the quantity of commercial salt shipped during the first eight months of 1938 compared with the corresponding period a year ago; the totals were 162,106 tons and 154,768 tons respectively.

Exports of salt in August totalled 1,007 tons; in the previous month, 1,210 tons were exported.

Canada imported 9,742 tons of salt worth \$43,730 in August; in July, 13,687 tons at \$48,322 were imported. The August importations were obtained from the following countries: the United States, 37.7 per cent; Great Britain, 34.4 per cent; British West Indies, 26.9 per cent and Newfoundland, 1.0 per cent. These imports were made up of 1,751 tons of salt for sea or gulf fisheries; 5,039 tons of salt in bulk, n.o.p., and 2,952 tons of salt in bags, barrels, or other coverings.
