## MONTHLY REPORT

FHEDSPAR and SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA © MARCH: 1939.

FELDSPAR - Shipments of feldspar by Canadian producers in March declined to 650 tons from the preceding month's total of 905 tons and the March, 1938 total of 818 tons, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first three months of the current year 2,317 tons were shipped compared with 2,864 tons in the corresponding period of 1938.

Exports of feldspar from Canada in Mar ch amounted to 295 tons; in February; 455 tons were exported. Nepheline - selenite exports during the month under review totalled 2,995 tons as against 1,850 tons in the preceding month.

Ground feldspar importations in March were recorded at 45 tons worth $\$ 762$, in the previous month, 92 tons at $\$ 1,544$ were imported. Crude feldspar receipts amounted to 55 tons at $\$ 274$, in February 145 tons valued at $\$ 724$ were imported.

SALT - Canadian producers sold 13,882 tons of commercial salt in March, in the preceding month, 10,982 tons were sold while in March, 1938 sales amounted to 13,650 tons. During the first three months of 1939, commercial said sales totalled 35,399 tons or 5.4 per cent below the tonnage sold a year ago.

A decline of 7.9 per cent was shown in the exports of salt from Canada in March; the months total was 763 tons compared with 828 tons in February. Exportation during the first quarter of this year aggregated 2,454 tons.

Imports of salt into Canada in March amounted to 4,144 tons worth $\$ 15,318$; in February, 5,057 tons at $\$ 15,693$ were imported. The United States supplied 82.1 per cent of the March importations, British West Indies, 10.7 per cent and Great Britain, the remainder. The March receipts included 3 tons of table salt worth $\$ 98 ; 407$ tons of salt for sea or gulf fisheries valued at $\$ 1,315 ; 3,234$ tons of salt in bulk, n.o.p. at $\$ 9,772$ and 410 tons of salt in bass, Barrels and other coverings at $\$ 4,133$.
