MONTHLY REPORT

FELDSPAR and SALT PRODUCTION IN CANADA - JULY, 1939.

FELDSPAR - Shipments of feldspar by Canadian producers amounted to 921 tons in July compared with 968 tons in June and 978 tons in July, 1938, according to a report just issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics at Ottawa. During the first seven months of the current year, 5,618 tons of feldspar were shipped; a year ago shipments totalled 7,144 tons.

Canada exported 725 tons of feldspar in July compared with 737 tons exported in the preceding month. Nepheline-sympite exports declined to 1,540 tons from the June total of 2,450 tons.

Ground feldspar imports during July rose to 101 tons worth \$1,650; in June, 49 tons at \$829 were imported. Receipts during the period January to July totalled 380 tons valued at \$6,013.



<u>SALT</u> - Commercial salt shipments in July reached a total of 22,925 tons; in June, 26,288 tons were shipped while in July, 1938, shipments amounted to 20,350 tons. During the seven months ending July Canadian producers shipped 129,162 tons or 7.3 per cent below the total for the corresponding months of 1938.

Customs' records show that Canada exported 538 tons of salt in July compared with 1,294 tons in the preceding month. Exports during the period January to July totalled 5,837 tons worth \$39,693.

Imports of salt in July were recorded at 12,626 tons worth \$53,189; this represented a decline of 11.4 per cent in quantity and 11.2 per cent in value from the June total. The July receipts included 1 ton of table salt at \$31; 5,080 tons of salt for sea or gulf fisheries worth \$10,430; 3,935 tons of salt in bulk, n.o.p., appraised at \$14,865, and 3,610 tons of salt in bags, barrels and other coverings with a valuation of \$27,863. The British West Indies supplied 38.4 per cent of the July importations; the United States, 33.8 per cent; Great Britain, 26.6 per cent, and Newfoundland, the remainder.
