JULY, 1946

Production of salt or natural sodium chloride in Canada during July, 1946 totalled 28,701 short tons, including 19,577 tons of table, common fine and other commercial grades, and 9,124 tons for the manufacture of chemicals. The total output for June, 1946 was 59,000 tons.

Shipments of commercial grades in July totalled 21,438 tons compared with 28,647 tons in June. Deliveries for chemical purposes totalled 30,562 tons in July compared with 31,097 tons in June.

Imports of salt, including all grades, totalled 14,408 tons at \$91,318 in July and exports amounted to 1,089 tons valued at \$17,181.

Canadian salt production at the present time comes entirely from the provinces of Nova Scotia, Ontario, Manitoba and Alberta.
