OCTOBER, 1947

Production of common salt in Canada during October, 1947 totalled 64,928 short tons, including 31,716 tons of table, common fine and other commercial grades, and 33,212 tons for the manufacture of chemicals. The total output for September, 1947 was 55,931 tons.

Shipments of commercial grades in October totalled 29,749 tons compared with 27,301 tons in September. Deliveries for chemical purposes totalled 32,955 tons in October compared with 30,222 tons in the previous month.

Imports of salt, including all grades, in October totalled 29,952 tons valued at \$172,222, and exports amounted to 1,165 tons valued at \$21,546.
