FEBRUARY - 1950

Production of common salt in Canada in February, 1950 totalled 58,759 tons, including 33,553 tons of dry salt and 25,206 tons of brine for the manufacture of chemicals. The total output for January was 56,153 tons.

Shipments of dry salt in February, 1950 totalled 32,820 tons compared with 29,328 tons in the previous month. Deliveries of brine for chemical purposes totalled 25,206 tons in February compared with 26,144 tons in January.
