

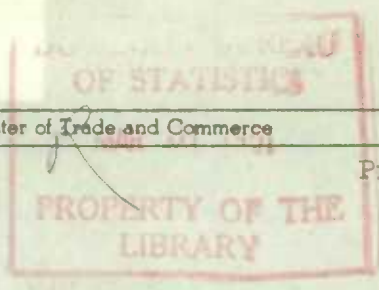

SALT

JANUARY - 1951

Production of common salt in Canada in January, 1951 totalled 71,602 tons, including 38,917 tons of dry salt and 32,685 tons of brine for the manufacture of chemicals. The total output for December, 1950 was 71,323 tons.

Shipments of dry salt in January, 1951 totalled 38,776 tons compared with 39,002 tons in December, 1950. Deliveries of brine for chemical purposes totalled 32,685 tons in January compared with 33,303 tons in December, 1950.
