FEBRUARY - 1951

Production of common salt in Canada in February, 1951 totalled 71,412 tons, including 40,887 tons of dry salt and 30,525 tons of brine for the manufacture of chemicals. The total output for January, 1951 was 71,602 tons.

Shipments of dry salt in February, 1951 totalled 38,594 tons compared with 38,776 tons in the previous month. Deliveries of brine for chemical purposes totalled 30,525 tons in February compared with 32,685 tons in January, 1951.
