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ADVANCE REPORT ON THE MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES

OF CANADA, 1942.

The manufacturing industries of Canada set up a new record of production in 1942 with an output valued at \$7,553,794,972. This represents an increase of \$1,477,486,848 or 24.3 per cent as compared with the previous year. The food, textile and chemical industries were the first to feel the effects of the stimulated demands created by the present war. With the progress of the war and its ever increasing demands for vehicles, aircraft and armaments of all kinds, the other groups, especially iron and non-ferrous metals, also experienced a tremendous expansion in production. For manufacturing as a whole there was an increase since 1939 of 117 per cent in the gross value of production, 116 per cent in the value added by manufacture, 75 per cent in the number of persons employed and 128 per cent in the salaries and wages paid.

The major increase in production, as measured by the number of persons employed, was reported by the industries listed below. Of the total increase in employees since 1939, totalling 493,977, 300,414 or 61 per cent was contributed by these twelve industries.

RAPPORT PRÉLIMINAIRE SUR LES INDUSTRIES

MANUFACTURIERES DU CANADA, 1942.

Les industries manufacturières du Canada ont atteint un nouveau sommet de production en 1942, soit \$7,553,794,972, ce qui représente une augmentation de \$1,477,486,848 ou 24.3 p.c. comparativement à l'année précédente. Les effets de la guerre se sont faits d'abord sentir dans les industries textiles, les produits alimentaires et les produits chimiques. Avec les progrès de la guerre, la demande pour les véhicules, les avions et les armements de toutes sortes étant devenue plus pressante, tous les produits du fer, de l'acier et des métaux non ferreux ont été fabriqués sur une plus grande échelle. Depuis 1939, il y a augmentation de 117 p.c. dans la valeur brute de la production globale, 116 p.c. dans la valeur nette, 75 p.c. dans le nombre d'employés et 128 p.c. dans les salaires et gages.

Ce sont les industries énumérées ci-dessous qui déclarent la plus forte augmentation de production tels que mesurée par le nombre de personnes employées. Depuis 1939, l'augmentation totale a été de 493,977 dont 300,414 ou 61 p.c. sont dans ces douze industries.

The greatest expansion in production in 1942, as measured by the number of persons employed, was reported by the chemicals and allied products group with an increase of 72.2 per cent. This was followed by the iron and its products group with an increase of 42.2 per cent, non-ferrous metal products 23.8 per cent, miscellaneous industries 21.9 per cent, non-metallic mineral products 6.5 per cent, animal products 6.0 per cent, textiles and textile products 5.5 per cent, wood and paper products 3.4 per cent, and vegetable products 1.5 per cent.

The table following gives the percentage increase in 1942 as compared with 1941 for all groups and provinces.

L'augmentation dans la production en 1942, telle que mesurée par le nombre de personnes employées est de 72.2 p.c. dans le groupe des produits chimiques. Viennent ensuite le groupe du fer et ses produits avec 42.2 p.c. d'augmentation, les produits des métaux non ferreux 23.8 p.c., les industries diverses, 21.9 p.c.. les métalloïdes 6.5 p.c., les produits animaux 6.0 p.c., les textiles 5.5 p.c., le groupe du bois et du papier 3.4 p.c. et les produits végétaux 1.5 p.c.

Manufacturing establishments reporting in 1942 numbered 27,862. Of these, 10,711 were located in Ontario, 9,342 in Quebec, 1,990 in British Columbia, 1,287 in Manitoba, 1,332 in Nova Scotia, 1,115 in Alberta, 966 in Saskatchewan, 867 in New Brunswick, 243 in Prince Edward Island, and 9 in the Yukon and Northwest Territories. These plants reported a capital investment of \$5,488,785,545 in fixed and current assets; they furnished employment to 1,152,091 persons who were paid \$1,682,804,842 in salaries and wages. They also produced goods with a gross selling value at the factory of \$7,553,794,972 and spent \$4,037,102,725 for materials, while the value added by manufacture

Le nombre d'établissements manufacturiers du Canada s'élève à 27,862 dont 10,711 dans l'Ontario, 9,342 dans le Québec, 1,990 dans la Colombie Britannique, 1,287 dans le Manitoba, 1,332 dans la Nouvelle-Ecosse, 1,115 dans l'Alberta, 966 dans la Saskatchewan, 867 dans le Nouveau-Brunswick, 243 dans l'Ile du Prince-Edouard et 9 dans le Yukon et les Territoires du Nord-Ouest. Ces établissements ont \$5,488,-785,545 en actif fixe et liquide; ils ont fourni du travail à 1,152,091 personnes qui ont reçu \$1,682,804,842 en salaires et gages. La valeur de leurs produits s'élève à \$7,553,794,-972 et les matières premières à \$4,037,102,725 tandis que la valeur ajoutée par la fabrication

totalled \$3,309,973,758. It should be remembered that the value added by manufacture does not represent the manufacturers' profits. The value added is obtained by subtracting the cost of materials, including fuel and power, from the value of the products. This difference represents the value added to the raw materials by labour. It is this difference which the employer of labour uses to pay for the labour itself, the overhead expenses, interest and profits. Compared with the previous year, there was an increase of \$704,853,-970 in the value added by manufacture. Of this amount \$417,942,199 was passed along in increased salary and wage payments to employees.

The manufacturing industries of Canada are concentrated largely in the provinces of Ontario and Quebec. Ontario is the dominant manufacturing province of Canada. In 1942 with only 38 per cent of the total number of establishments reporting, it employed 48 per cent of the capital, 47 per cent of the number of employees and produced over 50 per cent of the entire output. Quebec ranks second with 31 per cent of the output while British Columbia with 7 per cent of the output ranks third.

As mentioned previously the number of persons engaged in manufacturing in 1942 totalled 1,152,091 of whom 177,187 were classed as salaried employees and 974,904 as wage-earners. Compared with the previous year there was thus an increase of 190,913 employees. The increase in the number of male employees totalled 111,368 and female employees 79,545. To meet the shortage of manpower, more and more women are being absorbed in industry. Indicative of this trend is the increase in the proportion of women workers engaged in manufacturing. Whereas in 1939, out of every 1,000 workers employed 220 were females, in 1942 this figure jumped to 259. Earnings in 1942 also increased. Average salaries at \$1,890 were \$89 higher than in the previous year, while average wages at \$1,380 were \$160 higher.

A prominent feature of Canadian manufacturing development in recent years has been the growth of non-ferrous metal smelting and refining. This industry based on mineral resources has taken its place among the leading manufactures, along with the industries based upon forest, agricultural and live-stock resources. The pulp and paper industry, although of comparatively recent development in Canadian industry, had by 1933 displaced flour milling as Canada's most important manufacturing industry. In spite of recent vicissitudes it held that position up to 1935, when it was displaced by the non-ferrous metal smelting and refining industry. In salaries and wages paid, however, pulp and paper was still the dominant industry until 1941.

Il ne faut pas oublier que la valeur ajoutée par la fabrication ne représente pas les profits du manufacturier; elle s'obtient par la soustraction du coût des matières premières, plus le combustible et l'électricité, de la valeur brute des produits. Cette différence représente la valeur ajoutée à la matière première par le travail, laquelle sert à payer la main-d'œuvre, les frais d'exploitation, les intérêts et assure aussi le profit du manufacturier. Comparativement à l'année précédente, il y a augmentation de \$704,853,-970 dans la valeur nette. De ce montant, \$417,-942,199 représente l'augmentation dans les salaires et gages payés aux employés.

L'industrie manufacturière du Canada est centralisée principalement dans l'Ontario et le Québec. L'Ontario est à la tête du Dominion; en 1942 cette province, avec 38 p.c. des établissements emploie 48 p.c. des capitaux, 47 p.c. du nombre total des employés tandis que sa production s'élève à plus de 50 p.c. de la production totale. Québec suit avec 31 p.c. de la production, puis vient la Colombie Britannique avec 7 p.c.

Ainsi que nous l'avons dit précédemment, le nombre de personnes employées par les industries canadiennes en 1942 est de 1,152,091, dont 177,187 sont des employés à salaire et 974,904 employés à gages. Comparativement à l'année précédente, il y a augmentation de 190,913 employés. L'augmentation dans le nombre d'hommes employés s'élève à 111,368 et celle des femmes à 79,545. Afin d'obvier à la rareté de la main-d'œuvre masculine, on emploie de plus en plus les femmes dans les industries. Tandis qu'en 1939 sur chaque 1,000 employés, 220 étaient des femmes, en 1942 le nombre de femmes monte à 259. Il y a aussi augmentation dans les salaires et gages. La moyenne des salaires (\$1,890) est de \$89 plus élevée que celle de l'année précédente et celle des gages (\$1,380) plus élevée de \$160.

Un trait caractéristique du développement de l'industrie manufacturière canadienne ces dernières années a été la croissance de l'industrie de la réduction et de l'affinage des métaux autres que le fer. Cette industrie ayant pour base les ressources minérales, a pris place parmi les principales activités manufacturières basées sur les ressources des forêts, de l'agriculture et du bétail. L'industrie de la pulpe et du papier, quoique relativement jeune, était devenue l'industrie la plus importante du Canada en 1933 alors qu'elle supplantait les minoteries. En dépit des circonstances adverses, elle a conservé ce premier rang jusqu'en 1935. Cette année-là, l'affinage des métaux non ferreux monta, à son tour, au premier rang. Cependant, l'industrie de la pulpe et du papier fut première en ce qui concerne les salaires et les gages, jusqu'en 1941.

The incidence of the war resulted in a rearrangement in the rank of many industries. Industries producing supplies and equipment for the armed forces naturally advanced while those industries producing for the domestic consumers' market declined in importance. To supply the raw materials needed by the industries engaged principally in war production, it became necessary in many cases to restrict or prohibit the manufacture of many products such as pleasure cars, radios, washing machines, electrical equipment, household appliances, agricultural implements, etc. Many industries were thus forced to change over to war-time production. These changes, however, did not affect the value of the output of these industries, and consequently their importance as producers of manufactured goods did not alter drastically. To analyse the impact of the war on any industry it becomes necessary to compare the nature of the products made before the war with that of the present. For example, the number of employees engaged in the agricultural implements industry increased by 6,547 since 1939, this in spite of the fact that the output of agricultural implements increased but slightly. The main increase was due to a change over of some of the plants to war production. Due to the many changes in production occasioned by the present war, it becomes impossible to trace industrial trends from the principal statistics alone as published in the present report. To make a proper evaluation of any industry it is necessary to study the changes in the types of commodities produced. This should be borne in mind in making industrial comparisons with pre-war years.

The ten leading industries in 1942 in order of their importance were as follows:

La guerre a déterminé tout un remaniement dans l'ordre des industries. Naturellement, les industries produisant des fournitures et du matériel pour les forces armées ont pris de l'importance, tandis que celles engagées dans la production pour consommation domestique en ont perdu. Pour approvisionner de matières brutes les industries engagées principalement dans la production de guerre, il a fallu dans bien des cas limiter ou interdire la fabrication d'un grand nombre d'articles tels que: automobiles de promenade, radios, lessiveuses, accessoires électriques, machines agricoles, accessoires de ménage, etc.; ainsi, plusieurs industries ont dû transformer leurs produits en produits de guerre. Ces changements, toutefois, n'ont pas modifié la valeur de la production de ces industries et, partant, leur importance comme productrices de produits ouvrés n'a pas changé de façon radicale. Pour analyser le choc de la guerre sur une industrie quelconque, il faut comparer la nature des produits fabriqués avant la guerre et celle des produits fabriqués présentement. Par exemple, le nombre d'employés engagés dans l'industrie de la machinerie agricole a augmenté de 6,547 depuis 1939 et ceci, malgré la faible augmentation de production de machines agricoles. Cette augmentation dans la main-d'œuvre est attribuée au passage de certains des établissements à la production de guerre. En raison de nombreux changements déterminés dans la production par la guerre actuelle, il devient impossible, d'après les seules principales statistiques publiées dans ce rapport, de tracer l'orientation de l'industrie. Pour donner à une industrie quelconque sa valeur réelle, il est nécessaire d'étudier les changements dans les genres de produits fabriqués. Il faut donc compter tous ces faits dans les comparaisons entre les industries actuelles et celles de l'avant-guerre.

Les dix principales industries, par ordre d'importance, se classent comme suit:

1. - A change in the method of computing the number of wage-earners in the years 1925 to 1930 increased the number somewhat over that which the method otherwise used would have given. In 1931, however, the method in force prior to 1925 was re-adopted. The figures for 1931 and later years are, therefore, comparable with those for 1924 and earlier years.

1. - Vu la modification apportée à la méthode de calcul de 1925 à 1930 le nombre d'employés à gages est plus élevé qu'il ne l'aurait été si l'on s'était servi de l'ancienne méthode. En 1931, toutefois, la méthode antérieure à 1925 a été réadoptée. Les chiffres de 1931 et des années suivantes sont donc comparables avec ceux de 1924 et des années précédentes.

2. - In accordance with a resolution passed by the Conference of British Commonwealth Statisticians, 1935, the net value of production is now computed by subtracting the cost of fuel and electricity as well as the cost of materials from the gross value of the products. The figures for 1924 and later years have, therefore, been revised in accordance with this resolution. The revision could not be carried farther back as statistics for the cost of electricity are not available for years prior to 1924.

2. - En vertu d'une résolution adoptée à la conférence des Statisticiens du Commonwealth Britannique, en 1935, la valeur nette de production est maintenant calculée en soustrayant le coût des matières premières, plus le combustible et l'électricité, de la valeur brute des produits. Les chiffres de 1924 et des années postérieures ont donc été revisés conformément à cette résolution. Les calculs ne peuvent remonter plus haut que 1924, les statistiques du coût de l'électricité n'existant pas antérieurement à cette date.



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
