CANADA, 1945.

The gross output of manufactured products during 1945 was valued at \$8,250,368,866, a decrease of \$823,323,653 or 9.1 per cent as compared with the previous year. The physical volume of production was also lower and is reflected by a drop of 103,510 or 8.5 per cent in the number of persons employed. Salary and wage payments with a drop of \$183,847,921 were also 9.1 per cent lower.

The tremendous increase in production attained by the manufacturing industries of Canada during the war years is indicated by the increases in some of the main factors of production between 1939 and the highest point attained during the ~~war~~ <sup>war</sup> ~~years~~ <sup>for</sup> manufacturing as a whole, there was an increase of 161 per cent in the gross value of production, 162 per cent in the value added by manufacture, 89 per cent in the number of persons employed, and 175 per cent in the salaries and wages paid.

As was to be expected, the industries producing the munitions and equipment needed by the armed forces during the war would be the first to feel the effects of the cessation of hostilities. Consequently, the chemicals and allied products group suffered the greatest decline in production as measured by employment, with a drop of 25.8 per cent in the number of persons employed. This was followed by the iron and its products group with a drop of 21.9 per cent; non-ferrous metal products, 15.3 per cent; and miscellaneous industries 2.3 per cent. On the other hand, the industries producing food, clothing and other consumer goods reported increases in production. Employment in the wood and paper products group was 5.1 per cent higher, followed by an increase of 4.3 per cent for the animal products group; 3.5 per cent for vegetable products; 3.3 per cent for textiles and 3.0 per cent for non-metallic mineral products.

The following gives the percentage variation in 1945 as compared with 1944 for all groups and provinces.

RAPPORT PRELIMINAIRE SUR LES INDUSTRIES

MANUFACTURIÈRES DU CANADA, 1945.

La valeur brute de production manufacturière s'éleva à \$8,250,368,866, une diminution de \$823,323,653 ou 9.1 p.c. comparativement à l'année précédente. Le volume physique est aussi plus bas comme l'indique un déclin de 103,510 ou 8.5 p.c. dans le nombre des employés. Les salaires et gages ont aussi diminué de \$183,847,921 ou 9.1 p.c.

L'augmentation considérable dans la production des industries manufacturières du Canada durant les années de guerre est déterminée par les augmentations dans les facteurs de production les plus importants entre 1939 et le plus haut sommet atteint durant la guerre. Depuis 1939 il y a augmentation de 161 p.c. dans la valeur brute de la production globale, 162 p.c. dans la valeur nette, 89 p.c. dans le nombre d'employés et 175 p.c. dans les salaires et gages.

Comme il fallait s'y attendre les industries qui fabriquaient les munitions et l'équipement nécessaire à nos forces armées durant la guerre furent les premières à ressentir les effets de la cessation des hostilités. Conséquemment les produits chimiques qui ont subi une baisse de 25.8 p.c. dans le nombre de personnes employées déclarent la plus grande diminution de production. Viennent ensuite le groupe du fer et ses produits avec 21.9 p.c., produits des métaux non ferreux 15.3 p.c., et industries diverses 2.3 p.c. Par ailleurs, les industries produisant des aliments, des vêtements et autres denrées de consommation montrent des augmentations de production. L'emploi dans les produits du bois et du papier a augmenté de 5.1 p.c., les produits animaux de 4.3 p.c., les produits végétaux de 3.5 p.c., les textiles de 3.3 p.c. et la métallurgie de 3.0 p.c.

Manufacturing establishments reporting in 1945 numbered 29,050. Of these 234 were located in Prince Edward Island, 1,297 in Nova Scotia, 889 in New Brunswick, 10,038 in Quebec, 10,869 in Ontario, 1,302 in Manitoba, 926 in Saskatchewan, 1,157 in Alberta, 2,326 in British Columbia and 12 in the Yukon and Northwest Territories. These plants furnished employment to 1,119,372 persons who received \$1,845,773,449 in salaries and wages. They also produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$8,250,368,866 and spent \$4,473,668,847 for materials, while the value added by manufacture totalled \$3,564,315,899. It should be remembered that the value added by manufacture does not represent the manufacturers' profits. The value added is obtained by subtracting the cost of materials, including fuel and power, from the value of the products. This difference represents the value added to the raw materials by labour. It is this difference which the employer of labour uses to pay for the labour itself, the overhead expenses, interest and profits. Compared with the previous year, there was a decrease of \$451,460,111 in the value added by manufacture.

Le nombre d'établissements manufacturiers du Canada s'élève à 29,050 en 1945 dont 234 dans l'île du Prince-Edouard, 1,297 dans la Nouvelle-Ecosse, 889 au Nouveau Brunswick, 1,038 dans le Québec, 10,869 dans l'Ontario, 1,302 dans le Manitoba, 926 dans la Saskatchewan, 1,157 dans l'Alberta, 2,326 dans la Colombie Britannique et 12 dans le Yukon et Territoires du Nord-Ouest. Ces établissements ont fourni du travail à 1,119,372 personnes qui reçurent \$1,845,773,449 en salaires et gages. La valeur de leurs produits s'élève à \$8,250,368,866, les matières employées \$4,473,668,847, tandis que la valeur ajoutée par la fabrication est de \$3,564,315,899. Il ne faut pas oublier que la valeur ajoutée par la fabrication ne représente pas les profits du manufacturier; elle s'obtient par la soustraction du coût des matières premières, plus le combustible et l'électricité, de la valeur brute des produits. Cette différence représente la valeur ajoutée à la matière première pour le travail, laquelle sert à payer la main-d'œuvre, les frais d'exportations, les intérêts et les profits. Comparativement à l'année précédente il y a diminution de \$451,460,111 dans la valeur nette.

The manufacturing industries of Canada are concentrated largely in the provinces of Ontario and Quebec. Ontario is the dominant manufacturing province of Canada. In 1945, with only 37 per cent of the total number of establishments reporting it furnished employment to 46 per cent of the number of persons engaged in manufacturing and produced over 48 per cent of the entire output. Quebec with 31 per cent of the output ranks second, while British Columbia with 8 per cent ranks third.

L'industrie manufacturière du Canada est centralisée principalement dans l'Ontario et le Québec. L'Ontario est à la tête du Dominion. En 1945 cette province avec 37 p.c. des établissements, employait, 46 p.c. de la main-d'œuvre totale et produisait plus de 48 p.c. de la production globale. Le Québec avec 31 p.c. de production se classe deuxième et la Colombie-Britannique avec 8 p.c., troisième.

As mentioned previously the number of persons engaged in manufacturing in 1945 totalled 1,119,372 of whom 190,707 were classed as salaried employees and working proprietors and 928,665 as wage-earners. Compared with the previous year, there was thus a decrease of 103,510 employees. Male employees declined by 62,272 and female

Comme nous l'avons dit précédemment le nombre de personnes employées dans les industries canadiennes en 1945 s'élève à 1,119,372 dont 190,707 sont des employés à salaire et des propriétaires actifs et 928,665 des employés à gages. Comparativement à l'année précédente il y a donc diminution de 103,510 employés. Le nombre d'hommes a diminué de



employees by 41,238. To meet the shortage of manpower, more and more women were absorbed into industry. Indicative of this trend is the increase in the proportion of women workers engaged in manufacturing. Whereas in 1939, out of every 1,000 workers employed 220 were females; in 1944 this figure jumped to 287. With the end of the war many female workers on war work who lost their jobs were not absorbed by other industries with the result that the proportion of females employed in manufacturing dropped to 277 in 1945. Earnings in 1945 were \$1,649 as against \$1,660 the previous year. Average salaries at \$2,191 were \$25 higher, while average wages at \$1,538 were \$26 lower.

A prominent feature of Canadian manufacturing development in recent years has been the growth of non-ferrous metal smelting and refining. This industry based on mineral resources has taken its place among the leading manufactures, along with the industries based upon forest, agricultural and livestock resources. The pulp and paper industry, although of comparatively recent development in Canadian industry, had by 1933 displaced flour milling as Canada's most important manufacturing industry. In spite of recent vicissitudes it held that position up to 1935, when it was displaced by the non-ferrous metal smelting and refining industry. In salaries and wages paid, however, pulp and paper was still the dominant industry until 1941.

The incidence of the war resulted in a rearrangement in the rank of many industries. Industries producing supplies and equipment for the armed forces naturally advanced while those industries producing for the domestic consumers' market declined in importance. To supply the raw materials needed by the industries engaged principally in war production, it became necessary in many cases to restrict or prohibit the manufacture of many products such as pleasure cars, radios, washing machines, electrical equipment, household appliances, agricultural implements, etc. Many industries were thus forced to change over to war-time production. These changes, however, did not affect the value of the output of these industries, and consequently their importance as producers of manufactured goods did not alter drastically. To analyse the impact of the war on any industry it becomes necessary to compare the nature of the products made before the war with that of the war years. For example, the number of employees engaged in the agricultural implements industry increased by 8,747 between 1939 and 1944, this in spite of the fact that the output of agricultural implements increased but slightly. The main increase was due to a change over of some of the plants to war production. Due to the many changes in production occasioned by the war, it becomes impossible to trace industrial trends from the principal statistics alone as published in the present report. To make a proper evaluation of any industry it is necessary to study the changes in the types of commodities produced. This should be borne in mind in making industrial comparisons with pre-war years.

62,272 et celui des femmes de 41,238. Afin d'obvier à la rareté de la main-d'oeuvre on a employé de plus en plus les femmes dans les industries. Tandis qu'en 1939 sur chaque 1,000 employés 220 étaient des femmes, en 1945 le nombre de femmes monte à 287. A la cessation des hostilités les femmes qui occupaient des positions de guerre ont cessé de travailler, ce qui fait que la proportion des femmes employées dans les manufactures tombe à 277 en 1945. La moyenne des salaires et des gages en 1945 est de \$1,649 comparativement à \$1,660 l'année précédente. Le salaire moyen, \$2,191 est de \$25 plus élevé tandis que la moyenne des gages, \$1,538 est \$26 de moins.

Un trait caractéristique du développement de l'industrie manufacturière canadienne ces dernières années a été la croissance de l'industrie de la réduction et de l'affinage des métaux autres que le fer. Cette industrie ayant pour base les ressources minérales, a pris place parmi les principales activités manufacturières basées sur les ressources des forêts, de l'agriculture et du bétail. L'industrie de la pulpe et du papier, quoique relativement jeune, était devenue l'industrie la plus importante du Canada en 1933 alors qu'elle supplanta les minoteries. En dépit des circonstances adverses, elle a conservé ce premier rang jusqu'en 1935. Cette année-là, l'affinage des métaux non ferreux monta, à son tour, au premier rang. Cependant, l'industrie de la pulpe et du papier fut première en ce qui concerne les salaires et les gages, jusqu'en 1941.

La guerre a déterminé tout un remaniement dans l'ordre des industries. Naturellement, les industries produisant des fournitures et du matériel pour les forces armées ont pris de l'importance, tandis que celles engagées dans la production pour consommation domestique en ont perdu. Pour approvisionner des matières brutes les industries engagées principalement dans la production de guerre, il a fallu dans bien des cas limiter ou interdire la fabrication d'un grand nombre d'articles tels que: automobiles de promenade, radios, lessiveuses, accessoires électriques, machines agricoles, accessoires de ménage, etc. ainsi, plusieurs industries ont dû transformer leurs produits en produits de guerre. Ces changements, toutefois, n'ont pas modifié la valeur de la production de ces industries, et, partant, leur importance comme productrices de produits ouvrés n'a pas changé de façon radicale. Pour analyser le choc de la guerre sur une industrie quelconque, il faut comparer la nature des produits fabriqués avant la guerre et celle des produits fabriqués durant la guerre. Par exemple, le nombre d'employés engagés dans l'industrie de la machinerie agricole a augmenté de 8,747 entre 1939 et 1944 ceci, malgré la faible augmentation de production de machines agricoles. Cette augmentation dans la main-d'oeuvre est attribuée au passage de certains des établissements à la production de guerre. En raison de nombreux changements déterminés dans la production par la guerre il devient impossible, d'après les seules principales statistiques publiées dans ce rapport, de tracer l'orientation de l'industrie. Pour donner à une industrie quelconque sa valeur réelle, il est nécessaire d'étudier les changements dans les genres de produits fabriqués. Il faut donc compter tous ces faits dans les comparaisons entre les industries actuelles et celles de l'avant-guerre.

1. - A change in the method of computing the number of wage-earners in the years 1925 to 1930 increased the number somewhat over that which the method otherwise used would have given. In 1931, however, the method in force prior to 1925 was re-adopted. The figures for 1931 and later years are, therefore, comparable with those for 1924 and earlier years.

1. - Vu la modification apportée à la méthode de calcul de 1925 à 1930 le nombre d'employés à gages est plus élevé qu'il ne l'aurait été si l'on s'était servi de l'ancienne méthode. En 1931, toutefois, la méthode antérieure à 1925 a été réadoptée. Les chiffres de 1931 et des années suivantes sont donc comparables avec ceux de 1924 et des années précédentes.

2. - In accordance with a resolution passed by the Conference of British Commonwealth Statisticians, 1935, the net value of production is now computed by subtracting the cost of fuel and electricity as well as the cost of materials from the gross value of the products. The figures for 1924 and later years have, therefore, been revised in accordance with this resolution. The revision could not be carried farther back as statistics for the cost of electricity are not available for years prior to 1924.

2. - En vertu d'une résolution adoptée à la conférence des Statisticiens du Commonwealth Britannique, en 1935, la valeur nette de production est maintenant calculée en soustrayant le coût des matières premières, plus le combustible et l'électricité, de la valeur brute des produits. Les chiffres de 1924 et des années postérieures ont donc été révisés conformément à cette résolution. Les calculs ne peuvent remonter plus haut que 1924, les statistiques du coût de l'électricité n'existant pas antérieurement à cette date.
