SECTION I. - MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE MARITIME PROVINCES, 1941.

A report on the manufacturing industries of the Maritime Provinces for the year 1941 is presented herewith.

The report is divided into four sections. Section I deals with the three provinces as a group and the tables included therein show the principal statistics, statistics of the leading industries and statistics of the twenty leading cities and towns. Section 2 deals with the Province of Prince Edward Island, Section 3 with the Province of Nova Scotia and Section 4 with the Province of New Brunswick.

Manufacturing production in the Maritime Provinces advanced during 1941. Compared with the previous year, there was an increase of \$43,004,428 or 20.8 per cent in the gross value of production, 6,304 or 16.2 per cent in the number of persons employed, \$10,121,423 or 25.4 per cent in the amount of salaries and wages paid and \$13,891,165 or 16.1 per cent in the value added by manufacture.

As compared with the rest of Canada, the Maritime Provinces as a unit, did not receive as great a share of the increased production resulting from the demands created by the present war, as the following table shows:

On referring to Table 2, which gives the combined principal statistics of the Maritime Provinces, it will be noted that in 1941 there were 2,181 establishments reporting, with a capital investment in fixed and current assets of \$225,468,959. Employment was furnished to 45,282 persons who received \$49,926,629 in salaries and wages. The gross output was valued at \$249,956,630 while the cost of materials used amounted to \$139,243,361 and the value added by manufacture totalled \$99,963,319.

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE MARITIME PROVINCES, 1941

Pulp and paper with an output valued at \$34,822,760 was again the leading industry from the standpoint of the gross value of production. The production of primary iron and steel ranked second with a value of \$24,403,239, followed by saw-mills with \$17,657,671, fish curing and packing \$14,873,486, shipbuilding and repairs \$12,365,027, butter and cheese \$8,614,335, railway rolling-stock \$8,287,-144, etc. Sugar and petroleum refining are also important in the Maritime Provinces. Statistics for these cannot, however, be published as there are less than three establishments in each industry.

Manufacturing in Nova Scotia is to a considerable extent dominated by the steel and forest products industries, although there is a large sugar and petroleum refinery. The production of iron and steel products constitutes the main industrial group and accounted for \$42,742,111 or 31.9 per cent of the entire output of the province. Non-metallic mineral products came second with a value of production of \$21,454,897, followed by vegetable products with \$20,416,983, wood and paper products \$19,957,915, animal products \$15,850,349, textiles and textile products \$9,709,325, etc.

Forest products industries dominate the manufacturing field in New Brunswick. Production of wood and paper products led all groups in 1941 by a wide margin, the value of production being \$46,625,241. The vegetable products group followed with an output of \$23,751,874. Iron and steel products with a value of production of \$16,667,910 came third, followed by animal products with \$10,369,790, textiles and textile products \$7,615,145, etc.

Principal statistics of the leading cities and towns are given in Table 4. Saint John, N.B. with an output valued at \$31,588,775 was the leading manufacturing city in 1941. This was followed closely by Sydney, N.S. with an output of \$30,-606,037. Halifax, N.S. with \$26,933,018 was in third place and Moncton, N.B. with \$12,953,392 was fourth.

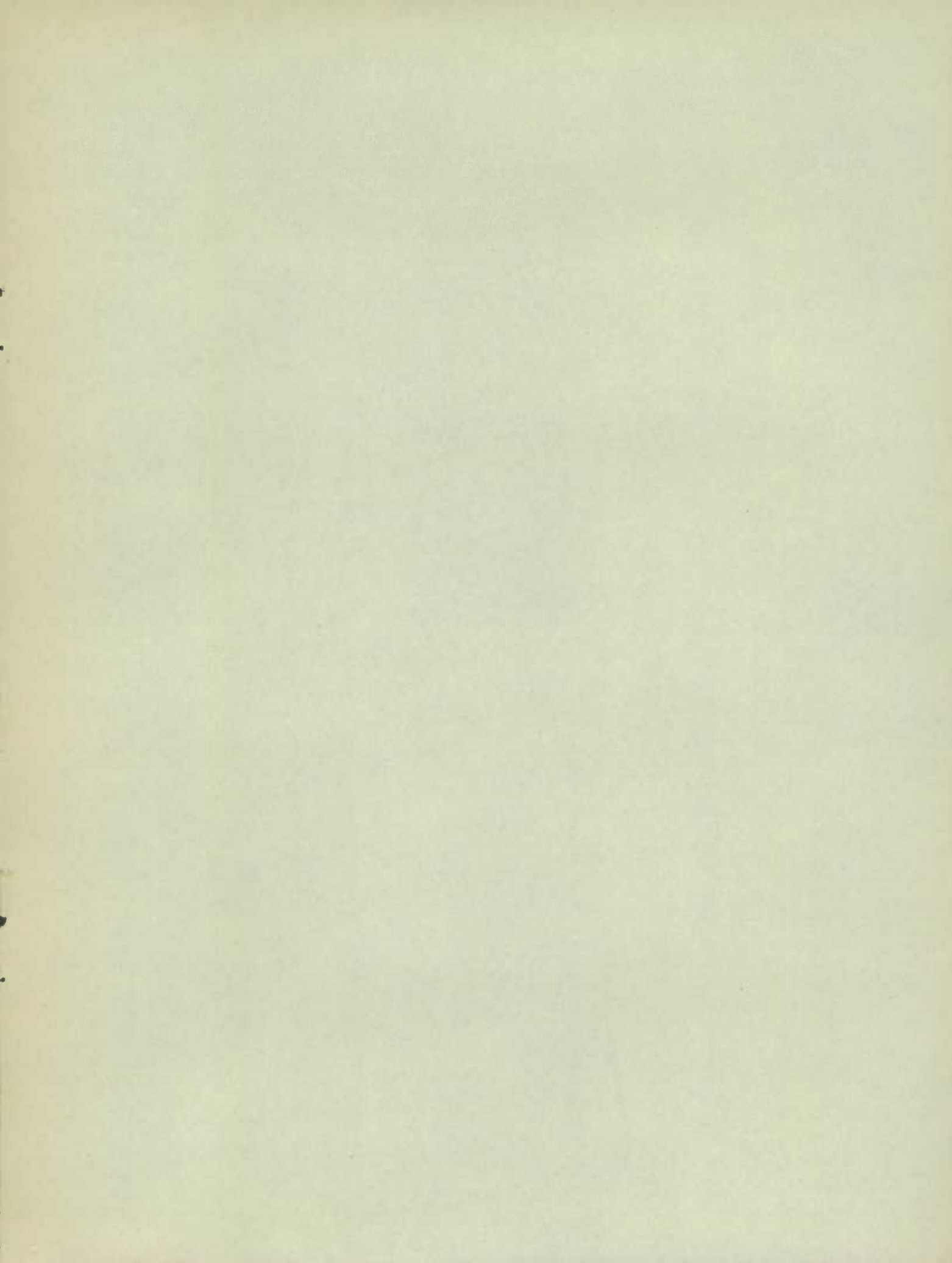
