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SECTION I. - MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE MARITIME PROVINCES, 1942

A report on the manufacturing industries of the Maritime Provinces for the year 1942 is presented herewith.

The report is divided into four sections. Section I deals with the three provinces as a group and the tables included therein show the principal statistics, statistics of the leading industries and statistics of the twenty leading cities and towns. Section 2 deals with the Province of Prince Edward Island, Section 3 with the Province of Nova Scotia and Section 4 with the Province of New Brunswick.

Manufacturing production in the Maritime Provinces advanced during 1942. Compared with the previous year, there was an increase of \$36,669,453 or 14.7 per cent in the gross value of production, 9,479 or 20.9 per cent in the number of persons employed, \$18,736,180 or 37.5 per cent in the amount of salaries and wages paid and \$19,546,595 or 19.5 per cent in the value added by manufacture.

As compared with the rest of Canada, the Maritime Provinces as a unit, did not at first receive as great a share on the increased production resulting from the demands created by the present war. In 1942, however, the increase was greater than for Canada as a whole. There was an increase of 20.9 per cent in the number of employees and 37.5 per cent in the salaries and wages paid. The corresponding increases for Canada were 19.9 and 33.0 per cent, respectively.

On referring to Table 2, which gives the combined principal statistics of the Maritime Provinces, it will be noted that in 1942 there were 2,442 establishments reporting, with a capital investment in fixed and current assets of \$261,092,992. Employment was furnished to 54,761 persons who received \$68,662,809 in salaries and wages. The gross output was valued at \$286,626,083, while the cost of materials used amounted to \$154,874,222 and the value added by manufacture totalled \$119,509,914

Pulp and paper with an output valued at \$34,739,901 was again the leading industry from the standpoint of the gross value of production. The production of primary iron and steel ranked second with a value of \$31,009,632, followed by saw-mills with \$22,078,680, shipbuilding and repairs \$20,681,008, fish curing and packing \$19,361,597, butter and cheese \$10,389,514, railway rolling-stock \$8,785,170, etc.

Sugar and petroleum refining are also important in the Maritime Provinces. Statistics for these cannot, however, be published as there are less than three establishments in each industry.

Manufacturing in Nova Scotia is to a considerable extent dominated by the steel and forest products industries, although there is a large sugar and petroleum refinery. The production of iron and steel products constitutes the main industrial group and accounted for \$59,694,095 or 38.3 per cent of the entire output of the province. Wood and paper products came second with a value of production of \$22,204,094, followed by non-metallic mineral products with \$21,559,457, animal products \$19,543,197, vegetable products \$17,081,369, textiles and textile products \$11,334,016, etc.

Forest products industries dominate the manufacturing field in New Brunswick. Production of wood and paper products led all groups in 1942 by a wide margin, the value of production being \$52,882,635. The vegetable products group followed with an output of \$24,947,222. Iron and steel products with a value of production of \$17,454,306 came third, followed by animal products with \$13,263,900, textiles and textile products \$7,914,935, etc.

Principal statistics of the leading cities and towns are given in Table 4. Sydney N.S., with an output valued at \$33,894,857 was the leading manufacturing city in 1942, followed closely by Saint John, N. B. with \$33,365,934 and Halifax, N.S., with \$32,931,486. Moncton, N.B. was in fourth place with \$13,389,520.
