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SECTION I. - MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE MARITIME PROVINCES, 1943

A report on the manufacturing industries of the Maritime Provinces for the year 1943 is presented herewith.

The report is divided into four sections. Section I deals with the three provinces as a group and the tables included therein show the principal statistics, statistics of the leading industries and statistics of the twenty leading cities and towns. Section 2 deals with the Province of Prince Edward Island, Section 3 with the Province of Nova Scotia and Section 4 with the Province of New Brunswick.

Manufacturing production in the Maritime Provinces continued to advance during 1943. Compared with the previous year, there was an increase of \$52,349,330 or 18.3 per cent in the gross value of production, 7,461 or 13.6 per cent in the number of persons employed, \$18,292,196 or 26.6 per cent in the amount of salaries and wages paid and \$27,378,298 or 29.0 per cent in the value added by manufacture.

As compared with the rest of Canada, the Maritime Provinces as a unit, did not at first receive as great a share on the increased production resulting from the demands created by the present war. In 1942 and 1943, however, the increase was greater than for Canada as a whole. Compared with the previous year there was an increase of 13.6 per cent in the number of employees and 26.6 per cent in salaries and wages paid. The corresponding increases for Canada were 7.7 and 18.1 per cent, respectively.

On referring to Table 2, which gives the combined principal statistics of the Maritime Provinces, it will be noted that in 1943 there were 2,370 establishments reporting, with a capital investment in fixed and current assets of \$294,553,445. Employment was furnished to 62,222 persons who received \$86,955,005 in salaries and wages. The gross output was valued at \$358,975,413, while the cost of materials used amounted to \$179,695,409 and the value added by manufacture totalled \$146,888,212.

Shipbuilding with an output valued at \$42,071,263 was the leading industry in 1943 from the standpoint of the gross value of production, displacing pulp and paper which normally is in first place. The production of pulp and paper ranked second with a value of \$37,201,163, followed by fish curing and packing with \$28,703,037, sawmills \$24,449,107, primary iron and steel \$23,931,519, butter and cheese \$12,564,621, railway rolling-stock \$8,082,152, etc. Sugar and petroleum refining are also important in the Maritime Provinces. Statistics for these cannot,

however, be published as there are less than three establishments in each industry.

Manufacturing in Nova Scotia is to a considerable extent dominated by the steel and forest products industries, although there is also a large sugar and petroleum refinery. The production of iron and steel products constitutes the main industrial group and accounted for \$79,993,879 or 42.4 per cent of the entire output of the Province. Wood and paper normally comes second, but in 1943 was outranked by the animal products group with a value of production of \$25,279,407. Wood and paper products came a close third with \$25,185,060, followed by non-metallic mineral products with \$24,924,747, vegetable products \$17,444,152, textiles and textile products \$11,437,088, etc.

The forest products industries dominate the manufacturing field in New Brunswick. Production of wood and paper products led all groups in 1943 by a wide margin, the gross value of production being \$56,842,659. The vegetable products group followed with an output of \$31,722,418. Iron and steel products with a value of production of \$18,950,490 came third, followed by animal products with \$17,970,536, textiles and textile products \$7,577,636, etc.

Principal statistics of the leading cities and towns are given in Table 4. Saint John, N.B. with an output valued at \$41,988,274 was the leading manufacturing city in 1943, followed by Halifax, N.S. with \$35,348,278, Sydney, N.S. \$29,482,649, Moncton, N.B. \$14,262,784, Trenton, N.S. \$12,230,900, Amherst, N.S. \$11,462,414.


