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SECTION I. - MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE MARITIME PROVINCES, 1944

A report on the manufacturing industries of the Maritime Provinces for the year 1944 is presented herewith.

The report is divided into four sections. Section I deals with the three provinces as a group and the tables included therein show the principal statistics, statistics of the leading industries and statistics of the twenty leading cities and towns. Section 2 deals with the Province of Prince Edward Island, Section 3 with the Province of Nova Scotia and Section 4 with the Province of New Brunswick.

Manufacturing production in the Maritime Provinces continued to advance during 1944 although at a declining rate. Compared with the previous year, there was an increase of \$28,266,472 or 8.3 per cent in the gross value of production, 540 or .9 per cent in the number of persons employed, \$7,025,249 or 8.1 per cent in the amount of salaries and wages paid and \$12,317,741 or 8.4 per cent in the value added by manufacture.

As compared with the rest of Canada, the Maritime Provinces as a unit, did not at first receive as great a share on the increased production resulting from the demands created by the present war. In 1942, 1943 and 1944, however, the increase was greater than for Canada as a whole. Compared with the previous year there was an increase of .9 per cent in the number of employees and 8.1 per cent in salaries and wages paid. The corresponding changes for Canada as a whole were a decline of 1.5 per cent in the number of employees and an increase of 2.1 per cent in the salaries and wages paid.

On referring to Table 2 which gives the combined principal statistics of the Maritime Provinces, it will be noted that in 1944 there were 2,459 establishments employing 62,762 persons who received \$93,980,254 in salaries and wages. The gross output was valued at \$367,241,885, while the cost of materials used amounted to \$194,450,232 and the value added by manufacture totalled \$159,205,951.

Shipbuilding with an output valued at \$48,658,783 was again the leading industry. The production of pulp and paper ranked second with a value of \$39,956,870, followed by fish curing and packing with \$31,789,144, primary iron and steel \$24,733,729, sawmills \$23,814,847, butter and cheese \$12,385,327, miscellaneous foods \$9,661,212, etc. Sugar and petroleum refining are also important in the Maritime Provinces. Statistics for these cannot, however, be published as there are less than three establishments in each industry.

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE MARITIME PROVINCES, 1944

Manufacturing in Nova Scotia is to a considerable extent dominated by the steel and forest products industries, although there is also a large sugar and petroleum refinery. The production of iron and steel products constitutes the main industrial group and accounted for \$87,071,066 or 42.6 per cent of the entire output of the Province. Wood and paper normally comes second, but in 1944 was outranked by the animal and non-metallic mineral products groups with values of production of \$27,685,124 and \$27,226,677 respectively. Wood and paper products came fourth with \$26,368,549, followed by vegetable products with \$20,728,350, textiles \$11,133,460, etc.

The forest products industries dominate the manufacturing field in New Brunswick. Production of wood and paper products again led all groups by a wide margin, the gross value of production being \$61,127,507. The vegetable products group followed with an output of \$36,918,876. Animal products with a value of production of \$19,890,034 came third, followed by iron and its products with \$19,073,167, textiles and textile products \$7,022,222, etc.

Principal statistics of leading cities and towns are given in Table 4. Saint John, N.B. with an output valued at \$43,586,062 was the leading manufacturing city in 1944, followed by Halifax, N.S. with \$37,324,862, Sydney, N.S. \$34,199,379, Picton, N.S. \$14,665,110, Moncton, N.B. \$14,043,130, Trenton, N.S. \$12,896,349, Amherst, N.S. \$8,529,543.
