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SECTION I. - MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE MARITIME PROVINCES, 1945

A report on the manufacturing industries of the Maritime Provinces for the year 1945 is presented herewith.

The report is divided into four sections. Section I deals with the three provinces as a group and the tables included therein show the principal statistics, statistics of the leading industries and statistics of the twenty leading cities and towns. Section 2 deals with the Province of Prince Edward Island, Section 3 with the Province of Nova Scotia and Section 4 with the Province of New Brunswick.

As was to be expected, the ending of the war in 1945 resulted in an immediate decline in the level of production in the Maritime Provinces as well as in the rest of Canada. Compared with the previous year there was, therefore, a decline of 4,985 in the number of persons employed, \$8,189,749 in the salaries and wages paid and \$8,289,253 in the net value of production. Due to the rise in prices, however, the gross value of production was slightly higher.

As compared with the rest of Canada, the Maritime Provinces as a unit, did not at first receive as great a share of the increased production resulting from the demands created by the war. Between 1942 and 1944, however, the increase was greater than for Canada as a whole, while the decline during 1945 was not as severe. Compared with the previous year there was a decrease of 7.9 per cent in the number of employees, and 8.7 per cent in the salaries and wages paid while the gross value of production was .2 per cent higher. The corresponding changes for Canada as a whole were declines of 8.5 per cent in the number of employees, 9.1 per cent in the salaries and wages paid and 9.1 per cent in the gross value of production.

On referring to Table 2 which gives the combined principal statistics of the Maritime Provinces, it will be noted that in 1945 there were 2,420 establishments employing 57,777 persons who received \$85,790,505 in salaries and wages. The gross output was valued at \$367,991,308, while the cost of materials used amounted to \$203,338,835 and the value added by manufacture totalled \$150,916,698.

Fish curing and packing with an output valued at \$42,995,750 was again the leading industry, having displaced the shipbuilding industry which occupied the premier position during the war years. The production of pulp and paper ranked second with a value of \$41,522,671, followed by shipbuilding and repairs with \$33,699,314, sawmills \$26,443,777, primary iron and steel \$24,418,793, butter and cheese \$12,789,080, miscellaneous foods \$10,563,740, etc. Sugar and petroleum refining are also important in the Maritimes. Statistics for these cannot, however, be published as there are less than three establishments in each industry.

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE MARITIME PROVINCES, 1945

Manufacturing in Nova Scotia is to a considerable extent dominated by the steel and forest products industries, although there is also a large sugar and petroleum refinery. The production of iron and steel products constitutes the main industrial group and accounted for \$75,706,067 or 37.8 per cent of the entire output of the Province. Wood and paper normally comes second, but in 1945 was outranked by the animal products group with a value of production of \$36,333,363. Wood and paper came third with \$27,166,180, followed by non-metallic mineral products with \$25,952,948, vegetable products \$19,466,381, textiles and textile products \$10,524,187, etc.

The forest products industries dominate the manufacturing field in New Brunswick. Production of wood and paper products again led all groups by a wide margin, the gross value of production being \$61,915,277. The vegetable products group followed with an output of \$37,485,690. Animal products with a value of production of \$23,337,762 came third, followed by iron and its products with \$16,703,161, textiles and textile products \$7,319,349, etc.

Principal statistics of the leading cities and towns are given in Table 4. Saint John, N.B. with an output valued at \$43,779,905 was again the leading manufacturing city. Halifax, N.S. with \$42,074,965 came second, followed by Sydney, N.S. with \$34,272,316, Trenton, N.S. \$17,569,746, Moncton, N.B. \$14,786,851, etc.
