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SECTION I. - MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE MARITIME PROVINCES, 1946

The present report on the manufacturing industries of the Maritime Provinces for the year 1946 is divided into four sections. Section I deals with the three provinces as a group and the tables included therein show the principal statistics, statistics of the leading industries and statistics of the twenty leading cities and towns. Section 2 deals with the Province of Prince Edward Island, Section 3 with the Province of Nova Scotia and Section 4 with the Province of New Brunswick.

As was to be expected, the ending of the war in 1945 resulted in an immediate decline in the level of production in the Maritime Provinces as well as throughout the rest of Canada. There was thus in 1945 a drop 4,985 in the number of persons employed, \$8,189,749 in the salaries and wages paid and \$8,289,253 in the net value of production. The decline continued throughout 1946 with the result that the number of persons employed declined by another 3,566, salaries and wages paid by \$7,926,858, and the net value of production by \$7,925,013.

As compared with the rest of Canada, the level of production in the Maritimes in 1946 was somewhat lower than for Canada as a whole. Manufacturers in this area in 1946 reported a drop of 6.2 per cent in the number of persons employed, 9.2 per cent in the salaries and wages paid and 2.0 per cent in the gross value of production. The corresponding changes for Canada as a whole were declines of 5.5 percent in the number of employees, 5.7 per cent in the salaries and wages paid and 2.6 per cent in the gross value of production.

On referring to Table 2 which gives the combined principal statistics of the Maritime Provinces, it will be noted that in 1946 there were 2,636 establishments employing 54,211 persons who received \$77,863,647 in salaries and wages. The gross output was valued at \$360,747,471, while the cost of materials used amounted to \$204,325,825, and the value added by manufacture totalled \$142,991,685.

Pulp and paper with an output valued at \$50,914,860 was the leading industry, having displaced the shipbuilding industry which occupied the premier position during the war years. The output of fish curing and packing plants which was valued at \$50,131,375 ranked second, followed by sawmills with a value of production of \$33,951,785, shipbuilding \$18,903,452, primary iron and steel \$14,942,738, butter and cheese \$12,746,864, miscellaneous foods \$11,407,388, etc. Sugar and petroleum refining as well as coke and gas products are also important in the Maritime Provinces. Statistics for these cannot, however, be published as there are less than three establishments in each industry.

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE MARITIME PROVINCES, 1946

Manufacturing in Nova Scotia is to a considerable extent dominated by the steel, forest and animal products industries, although there is also a large petroleum refinery as well as a large sugar refinery which has been idle for the past few years. The production of iron and steel products constitutes the main industrial group and accounted for \$42,029,197 or 23.3 per cent of the entire output of the Province. Wood and paper normally ranks second, but in 1945 and 1946 was outranked by the animal products group with a value of production of \$40,663,263. Wood and paper came third with \$36,329,530, followed by non-metallic mineral products with \$24,305,321, vegetable products \$19,584,643, textiles and textile products \$11,288,121, etc.

The forest products industries dominate the manufacturing field in New Brunswick. The output of wood and paper products again led all groups by a wide margin, the gross value of production being \$73,577,899. The vegetable products group followed with an output of \$39,611,771. Animal products with a value of production of \$24,323,155 came third, followed by iron and its products with \$14,983,484, textiles and textile products \$8,458,604, etc.

Principal statistics of the leading cities and towns are given in Table 4. Saint John, N.B. with an output valued at \$45,180,815 was again the leading manufacturing city. Halifax, N.S. with \$39,372,485 came second, followed by Sydney, N.S. with \$27,190,281, Moncton, N.B. \$14,708,695. etc. Dalhousie, N.B., Edmunston, N.B. and Bathurst, N.B. are also important manufacturing centres. Figures for these, however, cannot be published.
