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MANUFACTURING STATISTICS OF THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES, 1932.

Section I.

A report on the manufacturing industries of the Prairie Provinces for the year 1932 is presented herewith.

This report is divided into four sections. Section I deals with the three provinces as a group and the tables included therein review the principal statistics of the group from 1926 to 1932, together with statistics of the leading industries and leading cities and towns in 1932. Sections II, III and IV deal with the provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta respectively, and the tables included illustrate their manufacturing activities during recent years.

In 1932 the three Prairie Provinces continued to feel the effects of the general depression prevailing throughout the world. Compared with the previous year the gross value of production declined by \$43,722,050 or 19 per cent, while the number of employees declined by 3,088 and the salaries and wages paid by \$10,030,900. The cost of materials used was \$21,532,333 lower and the value added by manufacture also declined by \$22,189,717.

Establishments reporting in 1932 numbered 2,687 with a capital investment of \$354,450,263. These plants furnished employment to 38,964 persons who received \$42,435,765 in salaries and wages and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$187,451,377. The amount they paid out for materials totalled \$92,247,846 and the value added by manufacture amounted to \$95,203,531.

From the standpoint of value of production, flour and feed mills in 1932 led all industries with an output valued at \$24,246,761. This was followed by slaughtering and meat packing with an output of \$23,704,599; together these two industries accounted for over 25 per cent of the total production. The principal statistics of the ten leading industries are reviewed in table 2.

Table 3 shows the principal statistics of the leading cities and towns in the three provinces. In value of production the city of Winnipeg led with an output of \$56,415,286 which was followed by Calgary with a gross value of production of \$20,974,281. Other leading cities in the order named are: Edmonton, St. Boniface, Regina, Saskatoon and Moose Jaw.

SECTION II.

MANUFACTURING STATISTICS OF THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA, 1932.

Of the three Prairie Provinces, the province of Manitoba is the most industrialized. In 1932, establishments reporting to the Census of Manufactures numbered 970. These plants represented a capital investment of \$190,545,652; they furnished employment to 22,255 persons who received \$24,157,589 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$45,591,099 for materials and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$96,056,029.

The dominant industry in Manitoba is that of slaughtering and meat packing with a value of production in 1932 of \$13,011,468. This was followed by railway rolling stock with a value of production of \$8,936,011. Other industries of importance from the standpoint of value of production were: central electric stations, flour and feed mills, butter and cheese, etc.

Statistics by industrial groups for 1931 and 1932 are shown in table 3. Animal products with an output valued at \$21,459,394 led all the other groups in 1932. This was followed by vegetable products with a value of production of \$18,431,555, iron and its products \$12,999,992, wood and paper products \$12,550,257, textiles and textile products \$8,636,222, etc.

Table 5 contains the principal statistics of the industries composing the various groups shown in table 3.

Table 6 shows the principal statistics of the leading cities and towns in Manitoba. Winnipeg led with an output valued at \$56,415,286 which was over 63 per cent of the total production of the province exclusive of central electric stations. Table 7 gives the principal statistics of the industries located in the city of Winnipeg.

The capital invested in the manufacturing industries of Manitoba by groups is shown in table 8. Fixed capital, comprising land, buildings, machinery and tools, totalled \$155,779,758 in 1932 while the working capital, amounting to \$34,765,894, was made up as follows: materials on hand, stocks in process, etc., \$11,696,059, inventory value of finished products \$6,086,895 and cash, bills and accounts receivable \$16,982,940.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumed are shown in tables 9, 10 and 11.

SECTION III.

MANUFACTURING STATISTICS OF THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN, 1932.

Manufacturing production in the province of Saskatchewan continued to decline in 1932. In that year 774 establishments reported to the Census of Manufactures. Their total production amounted to \$36,101,516, a decrease of \$8,163,635 or 18.4 per cent as compared with 1931. The number of persons employed and the salaries and wages paid also declined in 1932. Employees declined by 526 to a total of 5,535 and the salaries and wages account dropped from \$7,546,703 in 1931 to \$6,392,062 in 1932, a decrease of \$1,154,641. The cost of materials used declined by \$4,326,063 to a total of \$18,214,555, while the value added by manufacture was also \$3,837,572 lower in 1932. Statistics showing these variations in detail may be noted in tables 1 and 2.

Table 3 gives the principal statistics of the manufacturing industries of the province, grouped according to a component material classification basis. In 1932, vegetable products with an output valued at \$13,306,228 led all groups in gross value of production. The animal products group with an output of \$7,314,183 was next in importance. This was followed by non-metallic mineral products (\$6,373,452), central electric stations (\$4,478,110), wood and paper products (\$3,507,144), etc.

Table 4 shows the principal statistics of the various industries composing the groups referred to in table 3.

The principal statistics of the leading industries in 1932 are shown in table 5. From the standpoint of gross value of production, flour and feed mills headed the list with an output of \$9,468,912 or 26.2 per cent of the total output of the province. Petroleum products, butter and cheese, central electric stations, slaughtering and meat packing, printing and publishing, etc., follow in the order named.

Table 6 shows the principal statistics of the cities and towns in Saskatchewan. The city of Regina is the most important manufacturing centre in the province. With an output valued at \$10,368,797 it accounted for almost 33 per cent of the total production of the province exclusive of central electric stations. Other important industrial cities with the value of their production were: Saskatoon \$7,704,435, Moose Jaw \$6,572,46 and Prince Albert \$1,907,291.

The amount of capital invested in the manufacturing industries of the province is shown in table 7 by groups of industries. Of the total of \$63,294,823, \$47,618,981 was invested in land, buildings, machinery and other equipment. Inventories of raw materials amounted to \$4,371,810. Inventories of finished products amounted to \$3,441,577 while operating capital, consisting of cash, accounts and bills receivable, etc., amounted to \$7,862,455. Compared with the previous year there was a decrease of \$3,411,596 in the value of land, buildings, machinery and other equipment and a decrease of \$1,841,447 in the amount of the inventories and the operating capital.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumption are shown in tables 8, 9 and 10.

SECTION IV.

MANUFACTURING STATISTICS OF THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, 1932.

The Census of Manufactures received reports from 943 establishments operating in Alberta in 1932. These establishments reported a total value of production of \$55,293,832 which was \$13,073,579 or 19.2 per cent lower than the total production for 1931 valued at \$68,367,411. The cost of materials also declined heavily in 1932, the value being \$28,442,192 or \$7,647,977 lower than the cost in 1931 which amounted to \$36,090,169. The number of establishments reporting showed an increase of fifty-seven. The capital invested, however, was \$6,817,815 lower, having dropped from \$107,427,603 in 1931 to \$100,609,788 in 1932. Employment was also furnished to 11,174 persons who received in salaries and wages \$11,886,114. Compared with 1931 there was a decrease of 624 in the number of persons employed and \$2,327,639 in the amount of salaries and wages paid. Tables 1 and 2 show these variations in detail.

Table 3 shows the principal statistics of the manufacturing industries of the province by groups of industries. The vegetable products group with a value of production of \$16,461,444 again came first in 1932. This was followed by animal products with an output valued at \$13,077,159, non-metallic mineral products \$7,328,792, wood and paper products \$6,810,597, etc.

Table 4 shows the principal statistics of the various industries which make up the groups shown in table 3.

Table 5 shows the principal statistics of the leading industries of Alberta. The principal ones from the point of view of the value of production are: slaughtering and meat packing with an output valued at \$8,437,040, flour and feed mills \$8,334,777, petroleum products \$5,363,289, central electric stations \$4,681,024 and butter and cheese \$4,515,025.

Table 6 shows the principal statistics of the cities and towns in Alberta. From the point of view of production, the city of Calgary with an output of \$20,974,281 is of major importance. Edmonton comes next with an output valued at \$14,806,333. The combined output of these two cities is equal to over 70 per cent of the total output of the province exclusive of central electric stations.

Table 7 shows the capital invested in the manufacturing industries of the province by industrial groups. Of the total investment of \$100,609,788, \$76,789,261 was invested in land, buildings, machinery and other equipment. Inventories of raw materials and stocks in process accounted for \$6,756,264. Inventories of finished products totalled \$6,914,420, while the balance of \$10,149,843 was made up of cash, accounts and bills receivable, etc.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumption are shown in tables 8, 9 and 10.
