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SECTION 1. - MANUFACTURING STATISTICS OF THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES, 1933.

A report on the manufacturing industries of the Prairie Provinces for the year 1933 is presented herewith.

This report is divided into four sections. Section 1 deals with the three provinces as a group and the tables included therein review the principal statistics of the group from 1926 to 1933, together with statistics of the leading industries and leading cities and towns in 1933. Sections 2, 3 and 4 deal with the provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta respectively, and the tables included illustrate their manufacturing activities during recent years.

In 1933 the three Prairie Provinces continued to feel the effects of the general depression prevailing throughout the world. Compared with the previous year the gross value of production declined by \$5,200,622 or 2.8 per cent, while the number of employees declined by 1,657 and the salaries and wages paid by \$4,969,004. The cost of materials used was \$1,119,494 higher, but the value added by manufacture declined by \$6,320,116.

Establishments reporting in 1933 numbered 2,866 with a capital investment of \$343,015,920. These plants furnished employment to 37,307 persons who received \$37,466,761 in salaries and wages and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$182,250,755. The amount they paid out for materials totalled \$93,367,340 and the value added by manufacture amounted to \$88,883,415.

From the standpoint of value of production, slaughtering and meat packing in 1933 led all industries with an output valued at \$25,468,444. This was followed by flour and feed mills with an output of \$24,445,073; together these two industries accounted for over 26 per cent of the total production. The principal statistics of the ten leading industries are reviewed in table 2.

Table 3 shows the principal statistics of the leading cities and towns in the three provinces. In value of production, the city of Winnipeg led with an output of \$59,287,280 which was followed by Calgary with a gross value of production of \$19,338,857. Other leading cities in the order named are: Edmonton, St. Boniface, Regina, Saskatoon and Moose Jaw.

SECTION 2. - MANUFACTURING STATISTICS OF THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA, 1933.

Of the three Prairie Provinces, the province of Manitoba is the most industrialized. In 1933 establishments reporting to the Census of Manufactures numbered 1,073. These plants represented a capital investment of \$179,720,120; they furnished employment to 20,749 persons who received \$20,699,449 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$44,697,266 for materials, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory of \$91,408,441.

The dominant industry in Manitoba is that of slaughtering and meat packing with a value of production in 1933 of \$13,616,669. This was followed by railway rolling stock with a value of production of \$7,307,355. Other industries of importance from the standpoint of value of production were: butter and cheese, flour and feed mills, and central electric stations.

Statistics by industrial groups for 1932 and 1933 are shown in table 4. Animal products with an output valued at \$22,425,021 led all the other groups in 1933. This was followed by vegetable products with a value of production of \$18,144,985, wood and paper products \$10,824,321, iron and steel products \$10,098,973, textiles and textile products \$8,741,717, etc.

Table 8 contains the principal statistics of the industries composing the various groups shown in table 6.

Table 9 shows the principal statistics of the leading cities and towns in Manitoba. Winnipeg led with an output valued at \$59,287,280 which was over 69 per cent of the total production of the province exclusive of central electric stations.

Table 10 gives the principal statistics of the industries located in the city of Winnipeg.

The capital invested in the manufacturing industries of Manitoba by groups is shown in table 11. Fixed capital, comprising land, buildings, machinery and tools, totalled \$143,737,225 in 1933, while the working capital, amounting to \$35,982,895, was made up as follows: materials on hand, stocks in process, etc., \$11,851,161, inventory value of finished products \$6,999,795 and cash, bills and accounts receivable \$17,131,939.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumed are shown in tables 12, 13 and 14.

SECTION 3. - MANUFACTURING STATISTICS OF THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN, 1933.

Manufacturing production in the province of Saskatchewan showed a slight improvement in 1933. In that year 818 establishments reported to the Census of Manufactures. Their total production amounted to \$36,199,608, an increase of \$98,092 over 1932. Employees increased by 79 to a total of 5,614, but the salaries and wages account dropped from \$6,392,062 in 1932 to \$5,871,180 in 1933, a decrease of \$520,882. The cost of materials used increased by \$950,364 to a total of \$19,164,919, while the value added by manufacture was \$852,272 lower in 1933. Statistics showing these variations in detail may be noted in tables 15 and 16.

Table 17 gives the principal statistics of the manufacturing industries of the province grouped according to a component material classification basis. In 1933 vegetable products with an output valued at \$12,831,801 led all groups in gross value of production. The animal products group with an output of \$8,437,290 was next in importance. This was followed by non-metallic mineral products (\$5,867,843), central electric stations (\$4,238,991), wood and paper products (\$3,164,965), etc.

Table 18 shows the principal statistics of the various industries composing the groups referred to in table 17.

The principal statistics of the leading industries in 1933 are shown in table 19. From the standpoint of gross value of production, flour and feed mills headed the list with an output of \$9,601,993 or 26.5 per cent of the total output of the province. Petroleum products, butter and cheese, central electric stations, slaughtering and meat packing, printing and publishing, etc., follow in the order named.

Table 20 shows the principal statistics of the cities and towns in Saskatchewan. The city of Regina is the most important manufacturing centre in the province. With an output valued at \$10,101,268 it accounted for almost 32 per cent of the total production of the province exclusive of central electric stations. Other important industrial cities with the value of their production were: Saskatoon \$7,566,086, Moose Jaw \$7,162,027 and Prince Albert \$1,674,483.

The amount of capital invested in the manufacturing industries of the province is shown in table 21 by groups of industries. Of the total of \$64,950,579, \$47,811,529 was invested in land, buildings, machinery and other equipment. Inventories of raw materials amounted to \$4,986,009. Inventories of finished products amounted to \$4,266,183, while operating capital, consisting of cash, accounts and bills receivable, etc., amounted to \$7,886,858. Compared with the previous year there were increases of \$192,548 in the value of land, buildings, machinery and other equipment and \$1,463,208 in the amount of the inventories and the operating capital.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumption are shown in tables 22, 23 and 24.

SECTION 4. - MANUFACTURING STATISTICS OF THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, 1933.

The Census of Manufactures received reports from 975 establishments operating in Alberta in 1933. These establishments reported a total value of production of \$54,642,706 which was \$651,126 or 1.1 per cent lower than the total production for 1932 valued at \$55,293,832. The cost of materials increased in 1933, the value being \$29,505,155 or \$1,062,963 more than the cost in 1932 which amounted to \$28,442,192. The number of establishments reporting showed an increase of thirty-two. The capital invested, however, was \$2,264,567 lower, having dropped from \$100,609,788 in 1932 to \$98,345,221 in 1933. Employment was also furnished to 10,944 persons who received in salaries and wages \$10,896,132. Compared with 1932 there was a decrease of 230 in the number of persons employed and \$989,982 in the amount of salaries and wages paid. Tables 25 and 26 show these variations in detail.

Table 27 shows the principal statistics of the manufacturing industries of the province by groups of industries. The vegetable products group with a value of production of \$16,142,838 again came first in 1933. This was followed by animal products with an output valued at \$14,994,019, non-metallic mineral products \$7,071,766, wood and paper products \$6,124,779, etc.

Table 28 shows the principal statistics of the various industries which make up the groups shown in table 27.

Table 29 shows the principal statistics of the leading industries of Alberta. The principal ones from the point of view of the value of production are: slaughtering and meat packing with an output valued at \$8,896,856, flour and feed mills \$8,358,555, butter and cheese \$5,300,810, petroleum products \$5,137,676, central electric stations \$4,465,926, etc.

Table 30 shows the principal statistics of the cities and towns in Alberta. From the point of view of production, the city of Calgary with an output of \$19,338,857 is of major importance. Edmonton comes next with an output valued at \$14,627,228. The combined output of these two cities is equal to over 66 per cent of the total output of the province exclusive of central electric stations.

Table 31 shows the capital invested in the manufacturing industries of the province by industrial groups. Of the total investment of \$98,345,221, \$74,475,088 was invested in land, buildings, machinery and other equipment. Inventories of raw materials and stocks in process accounted for \$6,731,119. Inventories of finished products totalled \$6,433,977, while the balance of \$10,705,037 was made up of cash, accounts and bills receivable, etc.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumption are shown in tables 32, 33 and 34.
