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SECTION 1. - MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES, 1936.

The report on the manufacturing industries of the Prairie Provinces for the year 1936 is presented herewith.

This report is divided into four sections. Section 1 deals with the three provinces as a group, and the tables included therein review the principal statistics of the group from 1929 to 1936, together with statistics of the leading industries and leading cities and towns in 1936. Sections 2, 3 and 4, deal with the Provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta respectively, and the tables included illustrate their manufacturing activities during recent years.

Manufacturing production in the Prairie Provinces recorded another advance in 1936. Compared with the previous year there were increases of \$28,223,449 or 12.9 per cent in the gross value of production, 2,273 or 6.0 per cent in the number of persons employed, \$3,611,545 or 9.2 per cent in the salaries and wages paid, \$18,862,917 or 13.6 per cent in the cost of materials used, \$6,642,467 or 2.9 per cent in the capital invested and \$8,337,037 or 11.6 per cent in the value added by manufacture.

Of the three Prairie Provinces, Alberta made the greatest gain in the number of employees and salaries and wages paid, while Saskatchewan led in the gross value of production. The increases in employment and production for the Prairie Provinces and Canada are given in the table following.

Establishments reporting in 1936 numbered 2,610 with a capital investment of \$230,795,976. These plants furnished employment to 40,045 persons who received \$42,832,148 in salaries and wages, and produced goods with a gross selling value at the factory of \$247,707,022, while the value added by manufacture amounted to \$85,201,213.

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PRAIRIE PROVINCES, 1936.

From the standpoint of value of production, slaughtering and meat packing again led all industries in 1936 with an output valued at \$52,519,615. This was followed by flour and feed mills with a production of \$36,715,734 and butter and cheese with \$23,219,381. These three industries accounted for over 45 per cent of the total production of the Prairie Provinces. Other leading industries, in the order named, were: petroleum products, railway rolling stock, printing and publishing, bread and other bakery products, breweries, etc. The principal statistics of the leading industries are reviewed in table 2.

The City of Winnipeg, with an output of \$73,316,055 is the most important manufacturing centre. Calgary, with an output of \$27,087,121 comes next. Other important cities, in the order named, are: Edmonton, St. Boniface, Moose Jaw, Saskatoon, Regina, Transcona, Medicine Hat, etc. Principal statistics of the leading cities and towns are given in table 3.

1/ The large decrease in the number of employees since 1931 is not entirely due to the decline in manufacturing production. The decrease is in part due to the change in method of computing the average annual employment of wage-earners. Between 1925 and 1930 the average was obtained by summing the averages of individual plants, based on the number of months in actual operation, and not by dividing by twelve the sum of the monthly employment figures. In 1931, however, a change was made to the old method whereby the aggregate of the monthly figures is divided by twelve. This method gives the man year that each plant operates. The change in method, therefore, affects the average annual employment as well as the average wages paid in seasonal industries, such as fruit and vegetable canning, fish canning, sawmills, etc.

2/ In 1935 a change was made in the method of calculating the "net value of production" in the non-ferrous metal smelting and refining industry, therefore the figures for this item, in that and following years, are lower than they would have been by the old method.

Raymond, Alberta, is also an important manufacturing centre. Statistics, however, cannot be published as there are less than three establishments reporting.

SECTION 2. - MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF MANITOBA, 1936.

Of the three Prairie Provinces, Manitoba is the most industrialized. The 1,011 establishments reporting under the Census of Manufactures furnished employment to 22,507 persons who were paid \$24,490,299 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$74,374,078 for materials, and produced goods with a selling value at the factory amounting to \$122,050,502, while the value added by manufacture totalled \$45,015,577. Considerable improvement was reported during the past three years. Compared with the previous year there was an increase in 1936 of 11.4 per cent in the gross value of production, 6.2 per cent in the number of persons employed, 9.3 per cent in the amount of salaries and wages paid and 13.8 per cent in the value added by manufacture.

The leading industry was slaughtering and meat packing which had a value of production of \$26,699,357. Railway rolling stock was next with \$10,916,608, followed by flour and feed mills, \$9,002,161; butter and cheese, \$8,449,575; printing and publishing, \$3,832,154; bread and other bakery products, \$3,291,015, etc.

Statistics by industrial groups for 1935 and 1936 are shown in table 6. Animal products, with an output valued at \$37,988,499, again led all other groups. This was followed by vegetable products with a value of production of \$25,260,279, iron and steel products, \$16,021,297; wood and paper products, \$15,215,753; textiles and textile products, \$9,291,809, etc.

Winnipeg is the most important manufacturing centre in the Prairie Provinces. With a production valued at \$73,316,055 it accounted for approximately 60 per cent of the entire output of the province of Manitoba. St. Boniface is in second place with a production of \$22,404,098 or about 18 per cent of the provincial total. Other cities of importance are: Transcona, Portage la Prairie, Selkirk, Brandon and The Pas.

The item "all other vegetable products" includes: - 2 macaroni and kindred products, 2 prepared breakfast foods, 1 stock and poultry foods, 2 tobacco, cigars, and cigarettes and 1 linseed and soyabean oil.

The item "all other animal products" includes 2 fur dressing and dyeing, 2 leather tanneries, and 2 ice cream (dairy products, n.e.s.).

The item, "all other wood and paper products" includes 2 roofing paper, 2 lithographing, 1 blueprinting, 2 typesetting and trade composition, 1 sawmill, 2 refrigerators, other than gas and electric, 1 cooperage, 1 beekeepers' and poultrymen's supplies, 2 excelsior, 2 miscellaneous wood-using industries and 2 lithographing.

The item, "all other iron and steel products" includes 1 steel ingots and castings, 2 agricultural implements, 2 railway rolling stock, 1 wire and wire goods, 2 miscellaneous iron and steel products, 1 bridge building and structural steel work, 1 automobile, and 1 aircraft.

The item, "all other manufactures of non-ferrous metals" includes 2 white metal alloys and 1 miscellaneous non-ferrous metal products.

The item, "all other manufactures of non-metallic minerals" includes 2 pressed and blown glass, 1 petroleum refining, 1 cement products, 1 gypsum products, 1 clay products from domestic clay and 1 lime.

The item, "all other miscellaneous industries" includes 1 carpets, mats and rugs, 1 fabric gloves, 2 sporting goods, 1 coal tar distillation, 1 compressed gases, 2 automobile accessories, fabric, 1 statuary, art goods and church supplies, 1 advertising and other novelties, 1 artificial ice and 1 regalia and society emblems.

SECTION 3. - MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF SASKATCHEWAN, 1936.

Manufacturing production in the Province of Saskatchewan continued to improve in 1936. In that year, 694 establishments reported to the Census of Manufactures, and their total production amounted to \$51,604,510, an increase of \$9,573,287 or 22.8 per cent as compared with 1935. Employees increased by 235 to a total of 5,782 persons, and the salaries and wages account rose from \$5,548,729 to \$6,013,378, an increase of \$464,649. The cost of materials used increased by \$7,323,845 to a total of \$35,311,152, while the value added by manufacture at \$15,185,500 was \$2,149,715 higher.

The principal statistics of the manufacturing industries of the Province, grouped on a component material classification basis, are given in table 16. The production of vegetable products, with an output valued at \$19,865,565 in 1936 led all groups in value of output. The animal products group with a value of production of \$15,713,173 was second. This was followed by non-metallic mineral products, non-ferrous metal products, wood and paper products, etc.

The flour and feed milling industry again headed the list with an output of \$15,451,759, or about 30 per cent of the total production of the Province. Slaughtering and meat packing, butter and cheese, petroleum products, printing and publishing, etc. follow in the order named. Non-ferrous metal smelting and refining is also an important industry. Statistics, however, cannot be published as there are less than three establishments reporting. Table 17 gives the statistics of all the industries established in Saskatchewan, while table 18 gives the principal statistics of the leading industries.

Using the value of production as a standard, Moose Jaw with \$14,148,709 was the most important manufacturing centre in Saskatchewan in 1936. Saskatoon with \$11,789,474 was second, while Regina with \$10,511,760 was third. As regards employment and salaries and wages paid, Regina is the dominant centre. This city employed 1,676 persons who were paid \$1,983,521 in salaries and wages, whereas in Moose Jaw only 953, and in Saskatoon 1,192 persons were employed. Table 19 shows the principal statistics of cities, towns and villages in the Province having three or more establishments.

SECTION 4. - MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, 1936.

The Census of Manufactures received reports from 905 establishments in Alberta in 1936. These establishments reported a gross value of production of \$74,052,010, a capital investment in fixed and current assets of \$70,224,578, and a payroll of 11,756 persons who received \$12,328,471 in salaries and wages. They also spent \$47,684,029 for materials and \$1,367,845 for fuel and electricity, leaving \$25,000,136 as the value added by manufacture.

The level of manufacturing production in 1936 was materially higher than in the previous year. Compared with 1935 there were increases of \$6,221,092 or 9.2 per cent in the gross value of production, 727 or 6.6 per cent in the number of employees, \$1,059,790 or 9.4 per cent in the amount of salaries and wages paid and \$1,230,830 or 5.2 per cent in the value added by manufacture. The capital invested was \$2,113,935 higher. Current assets increased by \$2,213,841 while fixed assets were down by \$99,906, mainly due to charges for depreciation.

Manufactures based on animal products, with a value of production of \$25,444,407, formed the the most important industrial group in 1936. This was closely followed by manufactures of vegetable products with an output valued at \$24,474,660. The non-metallic mineral products group came third with a production of \$9,516,834, followed by wood and paper products with \$7,759,026, iron and steel products \$4,283,106, etc. The principal statistics of the major industrial groups are given in table 25.

Slaughtering and meat packing, with an output valued at \$17,681,494 in 1936, was again the leading industry of the Province. This was followed by flour and feed mills with \$12,261,814, petroleum products \$7,410,882, butter and cheese \$7,337,840, etc. Sugar refining is also a leading industry in Alberta. Statistics, however, cannot be published as there are only two plants reporting. Statistics of each of the industries located in Alberta are given in table 26, while statistics of the leading industries are given in table 27.

The principal statistics of the cities and towns in Alberta having three or more establishments are presented in table 28. From the point of view of production, the City of Calgary, with an output valued at \$27,087,121, was of major importance. Edmonton came next with an output of \$23,262,664. The combined output of these two cities amounted to about 68 per cent of the provincial total. Medicine Hat and Lethbridge followed in the order named.
