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MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA AND
THE YUKON TERRITORY, 1936.

The general improvement in manufacturing production commenced in the summer of 1933 was maintained during the past three years. Compared with the previous year, there was an increase in 1936 of 9.6 per cent in employment, and an increase of 14.7 per cent in the salaries and wages paid. An increase of 16.9 per cent was also recorded in the gross value of production, 14.8 per cent in the cost of materials used and 19.8 per cent in the value added by manufacture.

In 1936 reports were received from 1,695 establishments operating in British Columbia and the Yukon Territory. The combined output of these establishments was valued at \$216,136,078. Employment was furnished to 39,796 persons who were paid \$45,854,374 in salaries and wages. The cost of materials used was \$121,362,118, while the value added by manufacture amounted to \$87,780,346. The manufacturing activities of the Yukon Territory consisted of one bakery, one shipbuilding and one novelties plant.

In comparison with 1935 the industries of British Columbia and the Yukon Territory showed the following variations in their manufacturing activities. The number of establishments reporting increased by 25, with a decrease in the capital invested of \$11,736,565. Current assets were up \$4,000,468 while fixed assets, due in part to current charges for depreciation, were \$15,737,033 lower. The number of persons employed increased by 3,472 with a gain in the payroll of \$5,873,821. The amount spent on materials was \$15,700,519 higher, while the rise in the gross value of production was even greater, viz., \$31,249,593. Details are shown in tables 1 and 2.

Table 3 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1935 and 1936. From the standpoint of the value of production, the wood and paper products group with an output valued at \$81,285,404 led all others by a wide margin in both years. The vegetable products group of industries ranked second with a value of production of \$34,355,991, being followed by animal products with \$32,101,836, non-ferrous metal products \$27,800,388, etc.

British Columbia was in 1936 again the third most important manufacturing province in the Dominion with a gross value of production of \$216,136,078. About 21 per cent of this production, or \$45,546,430, was contributed by the sawmilling industry. The predominance of forest products industries in the industrial life of the Province is still further emphasized if to this figure be added \$15,396,905, the value of production of the pulp and paper industry which ranks third, second in importance among the industries of the Province is that of fish curing and packing with a gross value of production of \$16,364,712. The output of petroleum products was valued at \$9,253,691, slaughtering and meat packing \$9,037,142, etc. Statistics of the leading industries are given in table 4, while the statistics of the individual industries are given in table 5.

The principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages with three or more establishments are given in table 6. The City of Vancouver with a production of \$87,581,068 leads by a very wide margin, accounting for 40.5 per cent of the total for the Province. Other principal cities, with the value of their production, are: New Westminster with \$14,491,671 and Victoria with \$6,844,619. Trail is also an important manufacturing centre, statistics for which, however, cannot be published.

The principal statistics of all the industries located in Vancouver are given in table 7.

Details of capital investment in 1936 are shown by industrial groups in table 8. The total capital investment in 1936 amounted to \$250,686,403 and of this amount \$158,631,288 represented the value of land, buildings, machinery, tools and other equipment. Inventories of raw materials, finished products, fuel and supplies on hand accounted for \$49,448,153, while the balance of \$42,606,962 was made up of operating capital, such as cash, bills and accounts receivable, deferred charges, etc.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumption are shown in tables 9 and 10.
