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MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA AND  
THE YUKON TERRITORY, 1938.

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The upward climb in manufacturing production begun in the summer of 1933 reached its maximum intensity in 1937. In 1938 a minor recession was reported. Compared with the previous year there was a decrease of .9 per cent in employment, with an increase of .1 per cent in the salaries and wages paid. A decrease of 10.5 per cent was also reported in the gross value of production, 12.0 per cent in the cost of materials used and 8.9 per cent in the value added by manufacture.

In 1938 reports were received from 1,785 establishments operating in British Columbia and the Yukon Territory. The combined output of these establishments was valued at \$225,585,489. Employment was furnished to 42,213 persons who were paid \$52,044,823 in salaries and wages. The cost of materials used was \$127,196,430, while the value added by manufacture amounted to \$90,471,828. The manufacturing activities of the Yukon Territory consisted of one bakery, one shipbuilding, on novelties and one petroleum products plant.

In comparison with 1937 the industries of British Columbia and the Yukon Territory showed the following variations in their manufacturing activities. The number of establishments reporting increased by 72, with an increase in the capital invested of \$8,604,413. Current assets were up \$3,210,518 and fixed assets \$5,393,895. The number of persons employed decreased by 363 with a gain in the payroll of \$65,430. The amount spent on materials was \$17,269,916 lower while the drop in the gross value of production was even greater, viz., \$26,338,769. Details are shown in Tables 2 and 3.

Table 4 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1937 and 1938. From the standpoint of value of production, the wood and paper products group, with an output valued at \$82,171,123, led all others by a wide margin in both years. The animal products group ranked second with a value of production of \$37,530,139, being followed by vegetable products with \$33,720,878, non-ferrous metal products \$27,435,261, iron and its products \$15,224,229, non-metallic mineral products \$13,984,962, etc.

British Columbia was in 1938 again the third most important manufacturing province in the Dominion with a gross value of production of \$225,585,489. About 21 per cent of this production, viz., \$46,986,133, was contributed by the sawmilling industry. The predominance of forest products industries in the industrial life of the Province is still further emphasized if to this figure be added \$12,004,843, the value of production of the pulp and paper industry which ranks third. Second in importance among the industries of the Province is that of fish curing and packing, with a gross value of production of \$17,705,321. This was followed by pulp and paper with \$12,004,843, slaughtering and meat packing \$10,710,098, petroleum products \$9,178,542, bread and other bakery products \$6,882,809, etc. Statistics of the leading industries are given in table 5, while the statistics of the individual industries are given in Table 6.

The principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages with three or more establishments are given in Table 7. The City of Vancouver with a production of \$91,578,637 leads by a very wide margin, accounting for 40.6 per cent of the total for the Province. Other principal cities, with the value of production, are: New Westminster with \$14,705,107 and Victoria with \$8,696,852. Trail is also an important manufacturing centre, statistics, however, cannot be published.

The principal statistics of all the industries located in Vancouver are given in Table 8.

Details of capital investment in 1938 are shown by industrial groups in Table 9. The total capital investment in 1938 amounted to \$264,615,506 and of this amount \$171,541,707 represented the value of land, buildings, machinery, tools and other equipment. Inventories of raw materials, finished products, fuel and supplies on hand accounted for \$59,447,037, while the balance of \$33,826,762 was made up of operating capital, such as cash, bills and accounts receivable, deferred charges, etc.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumption are shown in Tables 10 and 11.
