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MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA, 1939.

The upward climb in manufacturing production begun in the summer of 1933 reached its maximum intensity in 1937. A minor recession was reported in 1938 and again an expanded production in 1939. Compared with the previous year there were increases of .8 per cent in the number of persons employed, 3.5 per cent in the salaries and wages paid, 10.0 per cent in the gross value of production and 14.1 per cent in the value added by manufacture.

In 1939 reports were received from 1,710 establishments operating in British Columbia. The combined output of these establishments was valued at \$247,948,600. Employment was furnished to 42,554 persons who were paid \$53,881,994 in salaries and wages. The cost of materials used was \$136,655,872, while the value added by manufacture amounted to \$103,263,292.

Table 4 compares the principal statistics of the industrial groups for the years 1938 and 1939. From the standpoint of value of production, the wood and paper products group, with an output valued at \$96,001,233, led all others by a wide margin in both years. The animal products group ranked second with a value of production of \$38,645,671, being followed by vegetable products with \$38,127,117, non-ferrous metal products \$27,178,076, iron and its products \$17,531,517, non-metallic mineral products \$13,684,146, etc.

British Columbia was in 1939 again the third most important manufacturing province in the Dominion with a gross value of production of \$247,948,600. About 22 per cent of this production, viz. \$54,685,280, was contributed by the sawmilling industry. The predominance of forest products industries in the industrial life of the Province is still further emphasized if to this figure be added \$16,005,957, the value of production of the pulp and paper industry which ranks third. Second in importance among the industries of the Province is that of fish curing and packing, with a gross value of production of \$17,473,982. This was followed by pulp and paper with \$16,005,957, slaughtering and meat packing \$11,901,799, petroleum products \$9,144,073, fruit and vegetable preparations \$6,677,352, etc. Statistics of the leading industries are given in table 5, while the statistics of the individual industries are given in Table 6.

The principal statistics of all cities, towns and villages with three or more establishments are given in Table 7. The City of Vancouver with a production of \$101,267,243 leads by a very wide margin, accounting for 40.8 per cent of the total for the Province. Other principal cities, with the value of production, are: New Westminster with \$16,345,782 and Victoria with \$9,141,121. Trail is also an important manufacturing centre, statistics, however, cannot be published.

MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES OF THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA

The principal statistics of all the industries located in Vancouver are given in Table 8.

Details of capital investment in 1939 are shown by industrial groups in Table 9. The total capital investment in 1939 amounted to \$274,969,502 and of this amount \$173,726,828 represented the value of land, buildings, machinery, tools and other equipment. Inventories of raw materials, finished products, fuel and supplies on hand accounted for \$57,129,834 while the balance of \$44,112,840 was made up of operating capital, such as cash, bills and accounts receivable, deferred charges, etc. Compared with the previous year there were increases of \$2,385,121 in the fixed and \$7,968,875 in the current assets.

Statistics of power equipment and fuel consumption are shown in Tables 10 and 11.
